**The Zob electron blue zone

(In response to last month's nasty story regarding the cruel and unusual behavior afforded to cones by Jeff and myself, Jeff has provided the following eloquent response! Ed.)

Last month I was criticized as being against the group known as PETC, People for the Ethical Treatment of Cones. In lieu of this, I have asked for a forum to respond accordingly to these charges.

NCCC CONVENTION, SO WHAT?

As preparations continue for the 44th annual NCCC convention in Hagerstown, Maryland, I thought I would try to give some background to our newer and prospective members on what this convention means to NVCC and why we are involved in it to the extent we are.

NCCC conventions are annual events that take place all over the country, depending on which NCCC region hosts the event. The NCCC regions submit bids to host conventions and the bids are voted on by all the club governors at the national meetings. Regions decide to make bids after canvassing their local clubs to gauge the level of interest of the regional membership in putting on the convention. This is a process that begins about three years before the actual convention.

The East Region, of which we are a part, voted to make a bid for the 2003 convention several years ago. Prior to that, the last East Region convention was in 1989 in the Poconos. Convention bids are opportunities for regions to “give back” something to the national organization, showcase regional hospitality and or expertise, provide a challenge for scores of local club members and last, but not least, to make money. Usually they are a combination of most if not all of these.

Although there is no mandated formula, it is pretty much a foregone conclusion that for a successful convention there must be first class racing. Accordingly, conventions need access to high quality race tracks and drag strips. In addition, convention bids need to be supported by expertise in not only running a convention generally but in running the various component events a well. The East Region is blessed with all of the ingredients – facilities, expertise, and a big membership base to draw on as well.

Our club is recognized as a group that is capable of organizing and running a major track event. Our annual “Spooktacular” event gets us national acclaim. Just match up the top points winners in the racing events with our Spooktacular entry list an you will see a huge correlation. We committed to put on the low speed autocross nearly two years ago.

Our reasons for supporting the convention are similar but not exactly like the East Region’s – we won’t make any money *directly*. Our efforts will help the region make money for the good of the whole region however. Our participation (continued page 6 column 2)

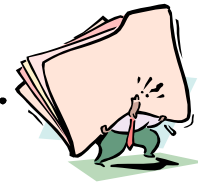
