Corvette as Camel!!

Your C5 has a camel mode to help protect you against a total loss of coolant and still be drivable for a while.

You're driving down the road and catch flying debris from Delbert in front of you and it punctures your radiator and your bleeding coolant. Your C5 has a contingency by a subroutine in the power train control module's software. Thanks to the conscientious efforts of GM calibration engineers like Mark Allen, every Corvette manufactured since 1997 has a built in safety cushion. An ingenious subroutine keeps the engine running a reasonable distance after the coolant is gone, so you can drive at a safe speed for service without fear of inflicting permanent damage.

The normal operating range for the Corvette's cooling system is 200-210 degrees F. "In the event of a total coolant loss, the driver receives various warnings" Allen notes. "The first is 'Engine hot', followed by 'Engine extremely hot', then finally 'Shut engine down'. If the driver ignores these ominous warnings and the temperature exceeds 265 degrees F, the engine management system takes over and the engine enters what Allen and his fellow calibrators call Corvette's "camel mode." He explains, "Once the overheat threshold is crossed, there's a 10- second delay before fuel delivery to one cylinder ceases. The engine spins another 240 revolutions (at 3000 rpm that takes less that 5 seconds) before a second cylinder is shut down. If the coolant temperature doesn't drop, the third and forth cylinders are disabled the same way, until the engine is making power in

In effect, the Corvette's water cooled V8 becomes an air-cooled four cylinder capable of making enough power to keep the car moving at a reasonable speed for several miles while major-components are protected from overheating.

"Every other cylinder in the firing order is disabled so the engine still runs smoothly." The disabled cylinders pump air, which keeps them from overheating, and every 240 revolutions, the subroutine switches to the opposite bank of cylinders, to give those that were working a rest.

Lest you dismiss the importance of your cooling altogether, Allen hastens to add that this "free ride" can't go on forever because the oil temperature will eventually climb past it's 320-degree F upper limit. Even equipped with Mobil I, not even the LSI or LS6 engines will run indefinitely under those conditions.

Made up of numerous area marquee and autocross clubs MWCSCC has been around at least 25 years promoting autocrossing and rallyes.
