Presidential Pontifications

It's been a quiet month for the NVCC, although a lot of work is being done in the background for some upcoming events. George Kerns has been working hard to get the year's final HPDE set and taken care of, as well as getting ready for his charity run to raise money for the Youth for Tomorrow. Andrej and Jim Beaupre have been putting the final touches on SpookTakular, and Judy's been busy getting out letters to our members for dues renewal.



I want to remind you that in October we'll be doing the initial nomination for chair-persons for the NVCC. As I've been President for the last 2 years, my obligation...err..despite my willingness to continue on, the by-laws prevent me from doing so. So it's up to the folks in the club to step up and make themselves known, and to help move this club forward. Where are those nominations for positions?

As I've said countless times, Paul Hertel, the former President prior to my term, and I, decided a few years ago to try and turn this club around from what we thought was a "static" situation. Our membership numbers stayed about the same, and the events that we did year in and year out didn't vary to much. Event participation for most events stayed about the same as well.

Overall, we wanted to accomplish several things. 1) PROMOTE THE NVCC. Get our name out there with the public, get some recognition so that other Corvette owners in the area would know we existed. We've also done this by changing how we give donations to charities. Instead of just writing a check and handing it over to a charity, we're trying to work with the charities and give not just from the club,

but from ourselves. 2) INCREASE MEMBERSHIP. This was done several ways, by using Item #1 to our advantage, work more with our sponsor to increase their awareness of who we were, 3) INCREASE CLUB PARTICIPATION. I hate to say this, but in conversations I've had with other groups, Corvette Clubs, and organizations, only so many people out of those groups want to participate in things. It's understood that family, and work, will always come first in our lives. So the best way we can increase participating, was to increase membership! Additionally, it seems that clubs that have a stronger social agenda tend to be larger, and stronger clubs. Laurie's done excellent work in getting that going, and I think the club is fortunate to have her onboard. 4) INCREASE OUR FINANCES. This, of all things that I have worked towards, has probably been the most painful and least appreciated, but I honestly think it's the one thing that the next president will HAVE to continue if this club is to succeed. As the club changes and grows, it needs to be able to adapt without being drastically affected. For example, over the few years that I've been a member of the NVCC, weekend outings at ODS were commonplace. With new management at ODS in place, management that wants to understandably succeed, the cost of running autocrosses at ODS went up from nothing, to \$1000, which other groups were paying to race on Sundays. Currently, our club has neither the funds, nor the amount of participation required, to make that even close to feasible. Instead, we were able to move into HPDE's and hopefully, next year, will be running an HPDE at the big track, maybe even VIR if we're lucky. I hope that we'll be able to find a suitable place for running low-speed autocrosses as well, something that I hope next years officers make a priority. Lastly, 5) IMPROVE OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH OUR SPONSOR. I can't thank enough the efforts of the 2 GM's at Koon's Chevrolet that I've worked with..Alex Perdikas and Carl Lechner. Both of these gentlemen have done more for the club in the last few years than anyone could have imagined, from buying us a trailer, to providing funds for some of our events, re-establishing our Concourse at Koons, and providing our club members some serious discounts on vehicles, and not just Corvettes!

I hope that each of you will find it within yourselves to help out next term, step up to the plate, and continue the effort that this council has put in thus far to get us where we are.

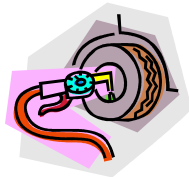

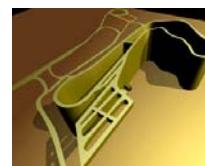
