They did show off a lot of their upcoming eco-friendly cars especially the Volt and Hydrogen fuel cell vehicles. The General also brought some of their other brands, notable models such as the CTS-V Coupe, the new Buick Regal, and some of the hybrid versions of their trucks and cars. Almost all of the other major car manufacturer were there with many of their exotics and prototypes, including the Mercedes-Benz SLR, Audi R8 V10, Prius-C (coupe), and other cool concept cars. One surprise missing manufacturer was Porsche, which in other years brought cars but no one was allowed to sit in them or in some cases get close to them.

There were also the usual exotic areas with Bentleys, Rolls Royce, Lamborghini, and Ferrari. Alongside that was a large area dedicated to racing with the SCCA, BSR, and a booth for the Baltimore Grand Prix. The eco area was very interesting and they had large displays for many different concept engines and fuel types. The American LeMans green racing group was there and brought a ZR1, which is what the current C6-R GT2 race car is based on.

The Tesla Roadster was also there and was cool to look at. I was offered to sit in it but I doubt I could fit, partially I didn't want to embarrass myself trying to get into it or worse yet break something by trying to get out of it.

All in all a good show, with many cars, a lot of cool concepts, and always fun to see which cars I can actually fit in and then dream over those I will never be able to afford. It was fun to see Fiat back next to the Chrysler area and even though I wore my Top Gear shirt both days, only the Fiat people recognized what Top Gear was.

Even though I enjoyed the show, the point reinforced was that it is a dealers show and not an enthusiasts show, which is probably why Porsche didn't show up. It was more about sales and obtaining leads than encouraging enthusiasm for automobiles and upcoming concepts. I hope in the future it will expand to that and in all the years I have been going it seems that the show has been expanding with new displays and interests but it's not quite where Detroit or LA is.





Can You Hear Me Now?

With spring just around the corner it won't be long before the NVCC begins its cruise season. If you haven't already done so, now is the time to consider purchasing a two-way radio. Owning a two-way "family" radio will make your cruising experience more enjoyable and a little safer.

With so much traffic congestion and roadwork, cruising in the DC metropolitan area can be a challenge. It is inevitable that a caravan of any size will become disjointed at some point(s) during a cruise. To ensure that no one gets left behind, and to make the cruise leader's job a little easier, participants should have in their possession a two-way radio. This will allow



those cruising to communicate with the lead vehicle, as well as others in a caravan. With two-way radio communication, if anyone should happen to get caught at a traffic light, get stuck behind a slow moving truck or has a mechanical issue, the lead vehicle can be notified and make adjustments to allow everyone to catch up.

A pair of good two-way radios can be purchased for under \$50. They can be found at outlets such as Best Buy and Radio Shack, or online at web sites like Amazon.com. When trying to decide between the various brands and models, the following features should be considered:

- Look for models with at least 22 channels. This will optimize your chances of finding an open channel.
- Preferred are models that are both FRS/GMRS with an actual range of one or two miles. Ignore any claims of 20+ miles. That level of performance can only be achieved under perfect conditions and with no obstructions between the two radios trying to communicate.
- Models with voice-activated transmission allow for hands-free usage. This is a big plus when taking a spirited cruise on twisty roads.
- Channel scanning lets you scroll through channels to find radio traffic. This will help you to find others who may be on the radio.
- A low-battery alert is another nice feature to have. Depending on the model, some alerts are visual while others are audible.
- Most models are powered by AA or AAA alkaline batteries. However, some models offer the option of using nickel-metal hydride (NiMH) rechargeable batteries or the alkaline variety.
- For those who own a "garage queen," look for a model that offers NOAA weather channels. This will allow you to get advisories in time to make it home before adverse weather strikes.
