





Spring TDS Another Big Success!

NVCC held its Spring 2012 Teen Driving School on Saturday April 21 at Old Dominion Speedway in Manassas, VA. Under ideal conditions of clear skies and



temperatures in the midseventies, the turnout of nearly 30 pre-registered teen drivers and their parents represented the start of Season Number Eight for NVCC to host this important communityservice. Bolstered by an excellent showing of eager

volunteers from NVCC, CCA, CVCC, and BACC, worker / instructor registration and course set-up got underway at the appointed 7:30 AM. Within minutes, students and parents also began to arrive and they too were quickly and professionally channeled through registration and a compulsory safety check of each vehicle, then directed to the bleachers for a brief morning orientation.

At orientation an announcement was made regarding NVCC's own Chief Instructor: Cassidy Nolen. The group was told that he would not be in attendance due to minor



injuries suffered just two days prior, as his car was struck shortly after he left work by a vehicle that ran a red light. It was a sobering reminder to all in attendance that driving is both a privilege and a responsibility that should never be taken lightly.

Fortunately, Ahsan Sheikh stepped up from his normal Skid Pad duties to take on the classroom instruction duties on short notice, and did a fine job of presenting the classroom material that would help the students better understand the dynamics of the various behind-the-wheel exercises they would later participate in.

As always, the TDS experience for both the students and their parents consisted of the Classroom portion, plus Car Care, Braking exercise, Slalom, and Skid Pad. In the case of Skid Pad, NVCC once again relied upon the generosity of Lake Jackson Volunteer Fire Department to provide manpower and equipment needed to deliver water throughout the day to keep the pad wet.



Changing the world, one kid at a time.

Thoughts from the 2012 Spring - NVCC Teen Driving School By: Ahsan Sheikh

Yesterday, I had the pleasure of instructing, for the 6th or 7th year in a row, at the NVCC Teen Driving School (TDS). I've been processing what I saw for the last 24 hours or so because there was so much to take in. Today, at church, the message I heard was pretty clear. "God didn't put us here to simply survive this world. He put us here to change it." Wow... Talk about timing. What I saw yesterday was an example of exactly that.

I saw the volunteers and instructors, NVCC members and friends, running around all day long in the cold of the morning and in the heat of the afternoon. I saw people eagerly helping others with a smile on their face and pep in their step. I saw people who were passionate about what they were doing and people that were glad to be there. Year after year it is amazing to me that so many people do so much to make this event happen. Not just on the day of the TDS but during the countless hours of meetings and prep work in the months leading up to the



event. Nobody at the TDS yesterday got paid a salary. Nobody was there serving community service. People were there because they wanted to make a difference. The sponsors donated money, time and more because they know this is a worthy cause.



We lose so many teenagers each year because they simply don't have the experience to deal with the emergency situations that they may face out there on the road. The typical risk taking behaviors of these teens combined with a feeling of invincibility almost invites tragedy. What we did yesterday was to show them how easily they can lose control of their vehicles. We showed them what their cars actually felt like when they were going out of control and how to

regain control, if possible. So many people react to emergency situations with a "fight or flight"

response instead of remaining calm. That is because many of us have never been in those situations before. How do we respond? What do we do? By putting these teens in these situations and teaching them how to respond correctly, and repeating the process, I truly believe that we are making a huge difference. Not only in how they react to situations but how they react to avoid putting themselves in those situations to begin with. Safe driving starts well before an emergency actually occurs. Yesterday, I saw that they understood. Ah, the mind of a teenager... This change happened because of you NVCC and friends of NVCC. Because of what you did yesterday.





Living in the Washington DC Metropolitan area, we're all very familiar with the "way things are" around here. So many people are rushing about with their own agendas, late as usual, and focused on themselves. Everybody has work, baseball games, dance rehearsals or other activities and we barely have time to eat, much less do things for others. Trying to change the entire world is a bit optimistic. But if you think about it, we all have our own world. Our family, friends, our lives are our own world. By helping one person, by making a difference in their life, we are indeed changing their own world. What I witnessed yesterday showed me that not all Washingtonians are just concerned with themselves. What I saw yesterday was a group of caring people who were changing the world, not just surviving it. They were indeed changing the world, one kid at a time.




Museum Hosts Wounded Warriors

It was a welcome getaway for those soldiers still in rehabilitation after being wounded in Afghanistan and Iraq. They received a tour at the plant, a tour of the Museum, lunch and \$50 gift cards as a "thank you" for their service.

"We like the idea of doing big events for veterans," said Museum Director Wendell Strode, "but we plan to do more of these smaller events too so that those in transition from Fort Knox to hospitals closer to their homes can enjoy the Museum as well. The City of Fairfax Independence Day Celebration Committee (IDCC) is looking for convertible owners to carry dignitaries in its July 4, 2012 parade. The dignitaries will include the Mayor, City Council Members, School Board Chair and Members, Grand Marshal, Honorary Grand Marshal, and other invited State and County folks. Below is the information passed along to us from Beverly Myers, Chair - IDCC:

"The parade will take place on Wednesday, July 4 in the City of Fairfax. If you have friends, neighbors, co-workers, etc. that have a convertible that might be interested, please pass this along to them. Time of arrival would be 8:00 am (due to street closures) with the parade stepping off at 10:00 am. If you are willing to help us out, please respond to this email not later than **Friday**, **June 8**. Please include the following in your response...

- Name
- Make/Model of Car
- · How many individuals would fit across the back of the car
- · Your t-shirt size
- Best phone # to reach you
- Email Address
- Mailing Address (for invitation to post-parade luncheon)

Signs will be adhered to the cars either by magnetic strip or non-waxed string. All drivers will be given a t-shirt and a hat when they arrive at the designated area (BB&T on Chain Bridge Road) as well as an invitation to the post-parade volunteer luncheon (Old Town Hall). Once drivers have delivered their passengers to the reviewing stand (City Hall) and don't want to stay for the parade and/or lunch, they will have access to leave the area via the parking lot behind City Hall turning left on 123 headed south towards Braddock Road. The majority of cars will be through the parade route around 10:30 am.

<u>Important Note</u>: A question that is often asked by the drivers is can they bring someone with them...it is not recommended as we need to make sure we have room for the passengers. We also tell passengers that they CANNOT take any food or beverage in the car in which they are riding.




As we get closer to the 2013 Corvette's official launch at the National Corvette Museum's Bash later this month, additional details about the final C6 Corvette are starting to trickle out. There is always excitement when GM introduces a new color choice for Corvettes and so when we came across an official Chevrolet Dealer document that shows an illustration of the new 2013 Corvette in Night Race Blue, we'll, let's just say we're very pleased with the addition of the new shade.

We sent this pic to Dave Salvatore at Kerbeck Corvette for his reaction and he told us that he has seen the actual color chip

and says that it appears even darker than the blue in this illustration. So it sounds like the name is very fitting and that Corvette buyers will be able to choose between the lighter-shaded Supersonic Blue and the really dark Night Race Blue.

Let's hope that we'll see the new Night Race Blue (GXH) on an actual Corvette at the Bash. Last year when Chevy rolled out the 2012 Corvettes, they only had a rear bumper painted Carlisle Blue Metallic to show the crowd and many of us were disappointed not be able to experience the new color fully painted on a Corvette under the beautiful Bowling Green sun.





The other major appearance change for the 2013 model year is the deletion of Competition Gray wheels, with Black Painted Aluminum wheels taking their place. Here is an illustration of the new wheels:
