
New GBM Meeting Location – Page Chevrolet

Corvette Racing Program Manager Doug Fehan, along with #3 Crew Chief Danny Binks, and championship winning driver of the #4 Corvette, Tommy Milner, were at the Bash sharing their excitement for what is happening with the Motorsports Park. "This is something Corvette owners have been dreaming about for years," said Doug. "Now we are on the cusp of actually making this happen. Jim Harbaugh to Pace Indy 500 in 2014 Corvette Stingray

Jim Harbaugh, head coach of the NFL's San Francisco 49ers, will drive the all-new 2014 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray Pace Car to lead the pack of 33 racers to the start of the 97th running of the Indianapolis 500 this Sunday.

Harbaugh, who took the 49ers to the Super Bowl this year, is no stranger to Indianapolis - serving as a quarterback for the Colts NFL team 1994-1997.

Harbaugh is also a racing fan and a principal at Panther

Racing, which fields the two-car, Chevrolet-powered IndyCar team including the No. 4 National Guard Chevrolet and the No. 60 Sunoco "Turbo" Chevrolet.

Harbaugh is also no stranger to Bowling Green, KY. His dad, Jack Harbaugh, served as head coach for the Western Kentucky University Hilltopper football team, and Jim served as an assistant coach for WKU from 1994-2001 while still playing in the NFL.

Harbaugh's stint behind the wheel of the Laguna Blue Pace Car marks a record 12th time the Corvette has served in the role, starting in 1978.

C7 continues tradition of attainable American performance

The running line regarding 2014 Chevrolet Corvette Stingray pricing has been vague. It usually goes something like: If you can afford today's car, you will be able to afford the C7.

That was proved true Friday, when Chevy said the latest generation of the iconic sports car will start at \$51,995, including destination charges. That is \$1,400 more than the 2013 model.

The convertible starts at \$56,995, also a \$1,400 increase compared with the 2013 drop-top.

The Corvette coupe is expected arrive in showrooms in September, followed by the convertible late in the year.

The C7 runs a 6.2-liter LT1 V8 pushing out at least 450 hp and 450 lb-ft of torque, capable of sprints to 60 mph in less than four seconds. It can be paired with a six-speed automatic with paddle shifters or a seven-speed manual gearbox. The aluminum frame is 99 pounds lighter than the previous generation, contributing to significant weight savings.

Notable options include the 3LT interior package (\$8,005), Z51 Performance Package (\$2,800) and Magnetic Ride Control (\$1,795). The sports car revealed at the Detroit Auto Show would have cost \$73,360.



Road trip on two of America's most famous roadways: Route 66 and the Pacific Coast Highway

Dick and his wife Denise are spending part of their summer taking a road trip across the country to spend time along two of America's most well-known highways – Route 66 (the "Main Street of America" as it is known colloquially), which originally ran from Chicago to Los Angeles, and the Pacific Coast Highway (California State Route 1), which runs along most of the Pacific coastline of California. Below is a log of their travels, with pictures and descriptions of places and things encountered along the way.

We departed Burke on 23 Apr for Fallingwater, Mill Run, PA; National Museum of the USAF, Dayton, OH; then on to Chicago for the start of Route 66 on 27 Apr.

Day 1 - 23 Apr - Mill Run, PA - Fallingwater

- Denise & I got away about 0730 today and had an uneventful four hour drive to Mill Run, PA, to tour Fallingwater designed by Frank Lloyd Wright. What an amazing architectural design and feat!
- We're in Donegal, PA, for the night. Tomorrow we're off to Young's Jersey Dairy in Yellow Springs, OH, and Dayton.

Day 2 - 24 Apr - National Museum of the USAF - Dayton, OH

- There are three things I hate to do in a Corvette...use the pop up headlights, use the windshield wipers, and drive in the rain...today I did all three! Other than driving in the rain for five hours from Donegal, PA, to Dayton, OH, it was a relaxed day. Many Thanks to our neighbor Ron Lindholm for his tip about Young's Jersey Dairy...Denise & I enjoyed some great ice cream!

Day 3 - 25 Apr - National Museum of the USAF - Dayton, OH

- Today was a full day at the National Museum of the US Air Force. The Museum Director, Lt Gen Jack Hudson (Retired), arranged Distinguished Visitor (DV) Parking and a Special Guided Two Hour Tour to cover the highlights. After this amazing tour, Denise and I watched the 3D movie "Space Junk". Having taught orbital mechanics and Space Satellite Systems for 22 years, it was super interesting. We had lunch at the Museum Cafe, then back for a more detailed look at the aircraft and displays. Boy, are our feet tired! The good news is my knees are fine after so much walking.
- Tonight we're going out to supper with a friend, former Goodfellow AFB Course Manager, now assigned at the National Air and Space Intelligence Center (NASIC), Wright-Patterson AFB. We're going to The Amber Rose Restaurant that specializes in homemade Eastern European Cuisine including German, Lithuanian, Polish, Hungarian, Russian and Italian cuisines. Yummo!

Day 4 - 26 Apr - National Museum of the USAF - Dayton, OH

The first day's Special Guided Tour was amazing but today's private tour of the Restoration facility (including The Memphis Bell) by the Restoration Director and impromptu tour of the R&D Aircraft (XB-70) as well as Presidential Aircraft by the Museum Director was fantastic! One of the highlights was being presented a NMUSAF Restoration Coin (can't buy these in a store). It will be a treasured keepsake. Many thanks to Lloyd Rowland for making this happen.




- We depart tomorrow for Chicago and the start of our real adventure...Part 1 — Route 66.

Day 5 - 27 Apr - Willowbrook, IL

- Finally, after days of "Practice Road Trip" to Fallingwater and Dayton, we made it to Chicago and the Eastern Terminus of Route 66 at the intersection of Lake Shore Drive and Jackson Ave. The good

news is it was a beautiful day; the bad news is everyone in Chicago was on Lake Shore Drive...the bumper-to-bumper traffic, the crowds, the crazies! We walked around, saw the sights between Millennium Park and Grant Park, including Buckingham Fountain, then fought our way on Route 66 along Adams St to Ogden Ave to Willowbrook, IL...about 30 miles.





Day 6 - 28 Apr

- One of the things we've noticed and liked is how great off season is...few people at Fallingwater and NMUSAF (except Friday was School Trip Day...hundreds of school kids running around!) and traffic is light.
- Also about 50 miles south of Chicago, near Remington, IL, there is a massive Wind Turbine Farm...I mean hundreds of wind turbines towers covering miles and miles of farm land. It was amazing! Each fan blade is 90 feet long with an 8 foot diameter base, the tower is 200 feet tall!
- Today, we travelled 195 miles in 7 hours for a total R66 of 225 miles...only 2200 miles to go.
- Lots along the way to Springfield, IL, and so much to do here, we decided to stay an extra day to visit all the Abe Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, Lincoln Home, Lincoln Tomb...and the famous Cozy Dog Drive Inn.





Day 7 - 29 Apr - Springfield, IL

- What a day in Old Springfield. We spent seven hours exploring Lincoln's House, Lincoln Library, and Lincoln Presidential Museum and then treating ourselves to a Cozy Dog.
- Tomorrow we're off again on Route 66 with our sights set on St Louis. We're also going to spend an extra day there to see the sights.

Day 8 - 30 Apr - St. Louis

- It was a strange day...route directions were very confusing so there were a few wrong/missed turns. Took 5 hours, with a lunch stop, to drive the 91 miles from Springfield to St. Louis.
- The big event today, besides becoming disoriented multiple times, was stopping at Henry's Rabbit Ranch.
- Wednesday will be a visit to the Gateway Arch and Forest Park (site of the 1904 World's Fair).

Day 9 - 1 May - St. Louis

- It was a fun "Zero Day" (no Route 66 mileage). It was truly an adventure getting to the Gateway Arch in late rush hour traffic. I think Washington DC drivers learned to drive in St. Louis...same crazies!

- We spent 5 hours at the Arch seeing two movies: historic footage on the Arch construction, and the Louis & Clark Expedition. We also saw Wilderness Museum, and took a tram to the Top of the Arch. But the Mississippi River was too high and fast to do a Riverboat cruise.
- On the way back to the Hotel, we stopped at Ted Drews Frozen Custard for an afternoon treat.



Day 10 - 2 May - Joplin, MO

- It was an excellent day...St. Louis to Joplin, MO...7.5 hours, 300 miles. This leg of the trip was a marriage saver...roads were good (only a couple bad spots...of course, anything but perfectly smooth is bad for a Corvette); lots of relaxed beautiful country side; very little, sometimes no traffic; and easy navigation with well marked routes. The only downside of the day was the weather. We left St. Louis in 70 degree weather with high overcast clouds, and arrived in Joplin in heavy rain and 40 degrees. First thing before dinner was to find the long pants and jacket!

Day 11 - 3 May Joplin, MO

 Didn't go far enough south yesterday to stay away from the bad weather...heavy rains turned into a light dusting of snow...not a happy camper. Temperature will warm up on the way to OKC, then just need to worry about Tornado Alley!

Weather warmed and cleared, found a self car wash to clean the road

grime off The Rocket, spirits brightened. It turned out to be another very nice 7.5 hours, 260 mile day. Route 66 has improved...it started out in Chicago and most of Illinois, congested and confusing, to small rural towns with long stretches through farm country to the next little town. In fact, some towns are so small, all we notice is the town sign, not even a stoplight!



Day 12 - 4 May - Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum

- All I can say is *powerful*. The Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum is amazing, sobering, and very well done. The bombing claimed 168 lives, including 19 children under the age of 6, and injured more than 680 people. The blast destroyed or damaged 324 buildings within a sixteen-block radius, destroyed or burned 86 cars, and shattered glass in 258 nearby buildings. The bomb was estimated to have caused at least \$652 million worth of damage. A 300 ft reflecting pool is in front of where the federal building stood. The open field has 168 chairs, with 19 smaller ones, and the location of the chairs is a projection of where each person died in the building.
- After the Memorial, we had a late lunch at the Steak and Catfish Barn...the outside isn't very inviting, the inside is a tribute to Elvis...the fried catfish dinner and peach cobbler was great!

Day 13 - 5 May - Wichita Falls, TX

- Took another "Zero Day" to drive 2 hours, 140 miles, south of Route 66 from Oklahoma City to Wichita Falls, TX, where I lived from 1958 to 1965...haven't been back since I graduated from High School some 48 years ago. Needless to say, things have changed a little.
- First was to look for our old house. There was a Tornado that went through the old neighborhood so not sure if it was destroyed and rebuilt. Next was to find the schools...Jefferson Elem, Barwise JHS, and Rider HS...all were there and expanded. Finally, find our family church it has had some remodeling but still there and even met the minister and two people I knew 48 years ago.
- It was a memorable blast from the past. Tomorrow, it's back to OKC and Route 66. Big event will be an Onion Burger in El Reno.

Day 14 - 6 May - Elk City, OK

- Today reminded me of a Tactical Reconnaissance Mission. Denise and I mission planned in Wichita

Falls (WF) Hotel, final crew briefing in the car, High Altitude cruise (Interstate) to OKC, as we approached OKC and Initial Point (IP), maps came out, hit the IP and went tactical (Route 66). The rest of the day was textbook to Elk City, OK. Mission Complete.

- One disappointment in WF...Rider High was having State Evaluation Testing and no visitors allowed so we couldn't drop by for chit-chat and tour.
- Big event today was a stop at Sid's Diner for their famous Onion Burger and Milk Shake. In fact, we missed the Annual Onion Burger Festival on Saturday. The Fire Department cooks a 1,200 lb Onion Burger...350 lbs of meat, 600 lbs bun, 150 lbs of onions, 5 5 Gal buckets of pickles, and can't remember how much mustard...for 10,000 people. Check it out on Google.
- Tomorrow it's a 140 mile day to Amarillo, TX for two days. We're staying at the Big Texan Steak Ranch...home of the 72 oz Steak! Check it out on Google.
