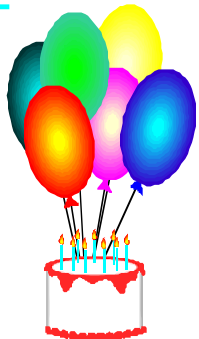

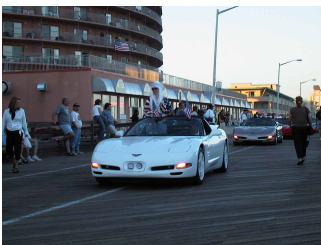

NVCC BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES - SEPTEMBER 24, 2002

Koons Conference Room, Tysons Corner, Va

Meeting Start: 7:34 pm

President: Paul Hertel opened the meeting with a reminder that members and guests should only park on the rooftop in unmarked spaces for the meetings. Everyone introduced themselves and most guests said that they found us through our web site.

Treasurer Report: Barbara Shaw presented the Treasurer's report for the month of August 2002.

Autocross Report: Mike Sarver reported that participation at the September 7 challenge event with the Capital Area Cobra Club and the Northern Virginia Mustang Club was 12 Corvettes, 7 Cobras, 8 Mustangs and 1 Viper. Three of the Cobras finished 4th, 6th and 7th overall. September 8 was the first Ladies Day event and 19 Corvettes participated. There are three more events for this year: October 5 and 20; and November 10. He mentioned that he will step down as Autocross Chairman at the end of this year. Anyone interested in taking over this position should contact Mike or one of the Council members. He is willing to be a co-chair and assist the new Chairman.

Concours: Don Kerndt reported that the trophies were mailed this week. The results were only mailed to non-NVCC members; members can look at the results on the web. A discussion was held on the 2003 date and it was recommended that Concours for next year be held May 4.

Historian: Jeff Kirk asked the following trivia questions:

- Q. What year did the ZR-1 first appear?
A. 1990 (Andrej Balanc - NVCC patch)
- Q. What was the first year that an AM-FM radio appeared as an option?
A. Late in the 1963 Corvette. The beginning of the year offered just the AM radio. (Mark Grigg - Spooktacular Shirt)
- Q. What was the first year a CB was offered as an option?
A. 1978 (Bob Compton - Spooktacular Shirt)
- Q. Dual 4-barrel carburetors were introduced in what year?
A. 1956 (Bob Compton - banner)
- Q. Four-wheel disc brakes were introduced in what year?
A. 1965 (Brad Sneade - 2 50-50 tickets)

Membership Report: Judy Patrick reported that there are 114 Active members and 13 prospective members. The "Dues" letter has been mailed to active members with a deadline of November 1. If any prospective member has questions, please see Judy after the meeting.

Newsletter Report: Mark Bergstrom reported that the newsletter was published and posted on the web. Please submit articles/photos for next month's newsletter by October 10. Mark will be stepping down as newsletter editor. He will provide guidance for the new volunteer.

NCCC Governor Report: Andrej Balanc reported that all was well with NCCC. If any member would like to see what other regional events are taking place, go to www.ernccc.org. He is currently working on obtaining high-speed licenses for members.

NCM Ambassador Report: Don Patrick reported that there was nothing new happening with the NCM this month.

Rallye Report: Dick Hammaker reported that the next rallye is November 3; Rallyemaster is Joe Daly. Since this is the final exam, be prepared for tricks. Information about this rallye will be published in the October newsletter. Dick will be stepping down as Rallye Chairman after 8 years. Please contact him or one of the council members to volunteer for this position.

Spooktacular Report: Andrej Balanc said that the T-shirts and medals have been ordered. Mike Sarver reported that there are 50 entrants registered (9 as entrant/worker); 47 have paid by check or money order; and 9 people registered on-line. Mike sent out electronic confirmations to everyone with email addresses (40). George will send out snail mail to everyone with additional information before the event. There are 13 paid orders for T-shirts. He also stated that the track will be run counter clockwise only per Summit Point contract. In order to receive a high speed license, you need to have participated in 10 low speed events in the past 18 months or 1 high speed driving school.

Ralph gave a pitch on volunteering as a corner worker emphasizing safety as the key item. He stated the vantage points of watching the cars on the track, time permitting, can ride with one of the participants in fun runs after the events are over, discount on shirts and lunches, and if you accumulate enough worker points, you could receive a jacket or shirt at the end of the year from the Eastern Region.

Web Master Report: Tom Green said there was nothing new to report.

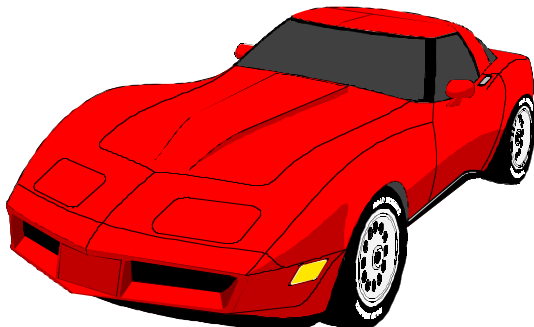

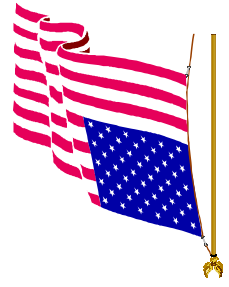

If you have a Family Radio, bring it along. I'll also provide you with my cell phone number in case you become "misplaced".

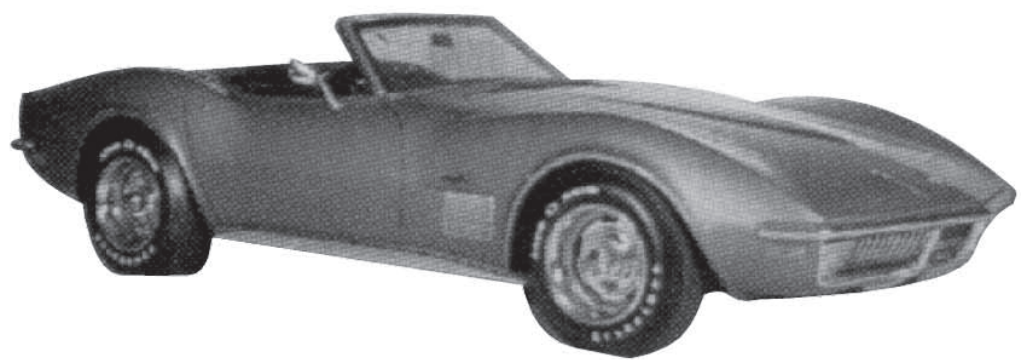
