HOW TO WAVE





You are most likely a Corvette Owner if

.... You yell "SAVE THE WAVE" to other Vette drivers when they don't wave back.

CORVETTE WAVE RULES

by Dan Woomer (October 23, 2003) Lost Caravan Corvette Club

The *Corvette Wave* is an integral part of the mystique and culture of the Corvette owner experience. Corvette owners who wave at fellow Corvette owners when they pass on the road, show a mark of recognition that you are among the elite group of intelligent people who are driving America's True Sports Car. And as a member of this elite group, you should be recognized for your poise and intelligence. So for those who don't know the five simple Corvette Wave rules, here they are:

- **1.** There is no excuse for not waving at your fellow Corvette owner. Although most Corvette owners have the class and understanding to accept when their wave is not returned, not waving is a serious breach of proper Corvette etiquette.
- **2.** Whoever sees the other Corvette first, starts the wave. There isn't any rule about who waves first. This is simple; if you see another Corvette, wave!
- 3. **Rules 1 and 2 apply to both sexes.** As far as who starts the wave, it doesn't make a difference if you are a man or women. Rules 1 and 2 apply.
- 4. **Any type of wave is okay.** Whether you shoot a big wave up through your open Vette top, out the window, or a quick salute with your **hand** on the steering wheel, any wave that can be seen by the other Corvette driver is okay. However, this does not include any style of jester that can be interpreted as obscene or insulting. Remember, Corvette owners are a class act; while someone might have been rude or stupid to you, try not to return the favor. (This is a tough rule not to break with all the stupid drivers who manage to get a driver's license.)
- **5.** A late wave is better than no wave. If you suddenly realize that a Corvette driver is passing and waving at you, get a wave off as soon as possible. The other Corvette driver may see your wave in their rear view mirror and realize that you where just a little late in getting your wave going. Although missing the timing of your wave is a "goof," getting off a wave that the other Corvette driver has a chance to see can acceptably cover this slip-up.

So you can see the underlying concept here is simple: Wave at your fellow Corvette owners, whoever they are, whenever you see them. This will show you are a person who understands the full measure and etiquette that comes with your proud ownership of a Corvette.

Ed. Note—6. Flashing your headlights for those driving C6 and C7 Corvettes, while laudable, is not the equivalent of a wave. If your windows are up, lean forward and wave through the windshield.

NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:32PM by President Kris McCandless, at Page Chevrolet, 6500 Little River Turnpike, Alexandria, VA 22312.

Two new members were present: Paul Rice ('67 vette), and Theda Ellis ('78 vette) – who found NVCC via Google. Three past NVCC presidents were also present: John Palmgren, Rick Poage, and Dick Hammaker.

The GBM minutes from May 2017 were unanimously approved.

The first order of business was an announcement by Kris about a conversation with Vince Brown/Page Chevy. Vince asked Kris to tell the membership that Page would like to have more members utilize their service program, and Page is increasing the service discount for NVCC members, from 13% to 20%, with a \$200 cap. Page is also asking for first right of refusal on sale/installation of OEM or after-market parts, including tires – and will match the price or do better on competitors' offers. Omar Gordon asked if the discount applies to online tire prices - and it does. In addition, Vince told Kris that Page will give a 25% discount on DIY parts purchases.

It was noted that Page now has two fully certified (GM and Corvette) service techs: John Magee, who is their principal tech; and James Locke. Steve Campbell and Glenda are their service writers.

Kris also announced that Page has given the Club several \$25 gift certificates for services, which will be raffled at the upcoming NVCC picnic.

<u>Club Donation</u> – Kris thanked Reece Burgoyne (who was absent) for his able assistance during the car show, as well as his donation of a 4-in-1 inkjet printer, which will come in handy for Club events, such as teen driving (to copy licenses and documentation).

<u>Car Show Recap</u> – Kris also thanked Jim Garner and Dave Dubois for managing an outstanding car show. Paul Fineberg, Bo Marlin, and Jim Dobish all won trophies at the show! The event was a success – and the Club will donate to MS as soon as John Stark reconciles the income and expenses. Kris also noted that we would like to attract more vendors at next year's show.

<u>Ice Cream Cruise</u> – Kris asked Mae Fromm for a recap of this event, which she led on June 24th. Twenty corvettes were led through to ice cream venues in three states (VA/MD/WV) and a good time was had by all!

<u>Social Media</u> – Mae also reported that she is working on uploading photos from the car show to Flickr and that the URL for the NVCC Flickr page is published in the newsletter.

<u>Winery Cruises</u> – Shawn Waddell wasn't present, however, Kris pointed out that the Barrel Oak Winery cruise was successful as always – and Shawn will also lead a cruise to DuCard Vineyards, on July 8th.

<u>Picnic Update</u> – The annual NVCC Picnic will take place on Sunday, July 16th at Rich and Cheryl Anderson's farm, in West Virginia. Kris will lead a cruise to the property – driver's meeting will be at 9:30am and the cruise will begin at 10:00am.

Kris asked for 4 volunteers for setup, 2 volunteers for grilling meats, and at least 2 volunteers to help with cleanup. The following members volunteered: Setup – Jerry & Irene Lelansky; Jim & Jo Garner. Grilling – John Palmgren, Paul Fineberg, and Mike Gilliland. Cleanup – Al Boone, who will be joined by several other members – it's Club tradition that we will always leave the property in good shape. Kris also asked for volunteers to bring ice, and Rick Poage suggested that coolers can be loaded with ice when the cruise stops at Sheetz gas station (on the way to the picnic).

Kris asked everyone to sign up for the picnic via the motorsportsreg.com (MSR) link; and although there's no charge for the picnic, registration provides a headcount for the Andersons to better plan food, drinks, and various supplies. 


