WHO IS RICHARD ANDERSON?

Richard Anderson ("Rich" to most everyone) is the Club's 35th President, one of only two members serving all three eligible terms for an officer from 2012 to 2014. (The other three-term president, Stewart Fox, preceded Rich as the 34th President). Being an environmental contractor for the Navy for many years, Rich was no stranger to Northern Virginia. In



the time I've known him, starting in his first year as President, he owned and rented out several houses, but was in process of making his move to the "country place" in Ganotown, West Virginia, a large-acre farm with garages, barns, sheds, fruit trees and flowers of all kinds. That is his full-time home now that he is re-



tired and has been home to the last eight NVCC Club Picnics, this year making nine (on Sunday, July 15).

But what makes him famous, in NVCC circles? Rich is probably most renowned for two reasons: he is the only member who owns one Corvette from every generation (except a C7), and, he has the biggest heart for generosity as he hosts and sup-

plies ALL of the food and drinks at the club picnic. Plus all of the fruit for the homemade pies from the Anderson Kitchen are gown on his farm! And they are delicious, most years including peach, apple, strawberry-rhubarb, and raspberry!

As the famous book states, "All Corvettes Are Red"; in Rich's case "all" but two are Blue, and those two are red! They are stored in two garages along with several other vintage cars and most of them run. It's like going to a car show and a picnic all in one, with swimming by the river, target practice, field games, and total relaxation for a day away from NOVA. Of course, being nestled between two mountains, the cruise from NOVA to Rich's house is most twisty and fun for those attending the picnic.

During most of his tenure as President, Rich usually drove one of his Vettes twice a month to club GBMs and Council meetings, demonstrating his dedication to NVCC and the seriousness with which he approached his responsibilities as President.

When our former dealer sponsor unilaterally decided to sever ties with NVCC, the club

was without a home for nearly six months. Under Rich's leadership, the club continued monthly GBM and Council meetings, keeping up activities until the Richard-led council worked with the then budding Page Chevrolet dealership, to establish a meeting place, home



Also, all security access forms once filled out, need to be mailed to Paul Fineberg (pfineberg@gmail.com), who will consolidate all and submit to the appropriate USO representative, who has requested it be handled in this fashion (one person to communicate with for all).

A map of the Walter Reed facility (see below) will be distributed at the GBM breakfast this month and will subsequently be mailed out to all.

This event is being co-hosted by CCA of Maryland with our club taking the lead on coordination with the USO and the setting up of the event. Between both clubs our goal is to have 30 cars at the event (this is the max allowed due to space restraints), and if we see we haven't reached that point over the next several months of registration, then our council might reach out to other clubs to fill the gap. In these initial stages, we are keeping things close to our club and CCA only for car entrants at this time.





DAVE'S FIRST KTM ADVENTURE By: Dave DuBois

Some of you know that I purchased a 2007 Austrian made KTM motorcycle this last spring. It has 450 cc and weighs 250 lbs. It is designed to be licensed for the street but is used mainly for dirt roads and motocross events. The KTM brand is considered to be one of the best dirt bikes. I bought it mainly for dirt roads and "seasonal use only" roads. I have no illusions of entering any motocross events.... at least this year.

I attended my first H U G E motorcycle event, Americade at Lake George, NY June $6^{\rm th}$ – June $9^{\rm th}$. There were over 63,000 attendees and sooo many motorcy-

cles. Also held at the same time, 11 miles west of Lake George is the Dirt Daze Adventure event. The Dirt Daze



Adventure event hosted over 250 "dual sport" motorcycles with a number of guided and unguided tours. I chose two unguided tours and had a great time exploring the mountains. The first trail consisted of an 8 mile ride on regular roads, 5 miles of dirt roads, to get to 12.6 miles of a seasonal use only – old logging road that was a dead end. It had steep climbs with terrible terrain, slick mud traps, large rocks, wash outs, etc. It even had signs saying "Steep/Blind Climb". This of course means it was exactly what I was looking for. I spent 2 hours going to the end of the 12.6 mile trail using mostly 1st

and 2nd gear. Going downhill on the way back was challenging also.

The second day I drove 15 road miles to get to a 15 mile network of dirt roads that led to many different camping sites on a mountain on the east side of Lake George. This included a small hike to a waterfall. I think my total mileage for the entire event was over 125 miles. My motorcycle road up in the back of my Tundra.

The evenings were spent in the village of Lake George with 63,000 of my closest friends watching an endless parade of all types of motorcycles. No motorcycle gangs attend this event and it is very family friendly. And YES, I was sore for a few days after that much fun!

I am 3 weeks into a major bathroom remodel and expect to explore a network of dirt roads in northern Pennsylvania very soon.

I will be going to the National Corvette Museum event at VIR June 25 & 26. My daughter is going with me also.

Hope to see some of my pals there!




A QUICK 2000 MILE ROAD TRIPTO ST. LOUIS

Memorial Day weekend for the last four years has become a venture to a new city each year with a group of 30 - 40 friends. This year, the journey was to Saint Louis. The flight options were nonstop but I did the old fashioned "get out the road map" strategy to see how we would get to St. Louis if we pulled the C7 out of the garage for the trip. The primary reason for the decision to drive was that we could take a route that would go right through Evansville, Indiana which is less than three hours from St. Louis. In Evansville, there is a World War II naval vessel which is set up as a museum. One of only two remaining ships of its type called an LST, it was used to deliver supplies such as tanks and trucks, artillery pieces and other critical items to our troops as well as landing the troops, too. The ships would pull right up onto the beach and unload. They were not a large ship by today's standards ... 5,000 tons ... with the crew of approximately 100 men. Add into the equation that the ship had a flat bottom to accommodate putting the vehicles on board and that the maximum speed was approximately 12 mph... You have a ship that was thrown all over the place when it was out on the ocean! It was an incredible asset and one of the most

recognized resources during World War II especially during D-Day and in the Pacific. On one of the ships, an 18 year old radio operator rode out the typhoons and survived kamikaze attacks and managed to turn 19 and make it to the end of the war. So stopping in Evansville, Indiana to see this type ship on which he ... my Dad ... served became the primary factor in the travel. The picture is a wonderful model of the ship and is built completely from Legos!

the Tail of the Dragon, Route 64 comes off of Route 81 down by Lexington, Virginia and is a magnificent road to enjoy going into West Virginia. Instead of having to focus on bumper-to-bumper traffic, we got a chance to enjoy a highway that allowed us to cruise at 75 through 90 mph with an additional bump up if needed to pass somebody! The C7 is simply stunning on an open road with the ability to go into the curves and power out of them very quickly and have incredible acceleration going up hills. After six hours of driving and getting through West Virginia and ready to move westbound, we stopped for the night and resumed our journey the following morning for the four hour leg to Evansville. Remitted to the museum area in the early afternoon. There is a dock area with the restaurant sort of like old town Alexandria with the one seafood place that overlooks the Potomac. I hope to be back on it with my brother and sister at some point within the next year to again pay respects to my Dad and his generation who, without fanfare or desire for attention, did so much.


