NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

SEPTEMBER 25, 2018—JOHN SCOTT—VP AND ACTING SECRETARY

Officers Present:

Kris McCandless, President John Scott, Vice President Jerry Lelansky, Officer at Large



The general business meeting was held at Page Chevrolet in Alexandria, VA. President Kris McCandless presided, and the meeting was called to order at 7:40pm.

Kris welcomed all members and noted the presence of former presidents: Dick Hammaker; Rick Poage; and John Palmgren. Several new members and prospects attended, including Bob Boyd, Dave Fraley, Aaron Street, Audrey Cupples, and Bill Root.

Tab announced that the store will feature a "BOGO" sale tonight.

The minutes for the August 2018 general business meeting were approved.

<u>Membership</u> – George Durk reported membership is at 107, including 11 prospects. He explained a snafu with Paypal that temporarily prevented processing of membership payments. It was decided that instead of trying to add more data fields to the Paypal form, we'll continue using the original registration form. It's important to keep the database current, and an email will be sent to everyone with the corrected link to Paypal.

RENEW YOUR DUES

<u>Warrior Transition Brigade</u> – Paul Fineberg reported that 172 plates of food were served – another indicator of a very successful event. A total of 34 cars were displayed and USO told Paul that this had turned out to be the #1 event ever held by USO at Walter Reed!

<u>Breaux Winery Cruise</u> – Event to be led by Shawn Waddell, this Saturday morning. 5 cars are signed up so far, and wine tasting will cost \$20 per person (to be paid in cash).

<u>Fall Rallye at Glory Days</u> – Ham reported that even with monsoon-like weather, 4 cars competed in the rallye (and only 1 was a Vette)!

<u>Upcoming Officer Elections</u> – Kris reminded everyone that nominations for the Club's five officer positions will take during the October GBM and during the first half of the November GBM, after which voting from members present at the November GBM will commence.

Unofficially, Mike Gilliland has agreed to be nominated for President, and Omar Gordon has agreed to run as treasurer. Vicki Allen will not run as secretary in her third eligible year and we need candidates for that position.

Fall Picnic at the Flying Circus Aerodrome in Bealeton, VA — This is a joint event with Piedmont Corvette Club, on Sunday, October 7th. Entry fee is \$10 per person and includes the air show (begins at @2:30pm and ends at 4pm). Kris will lead the NVCC cruise from Tackett's Mill in Woodbridge, which will arrive at the Aerodrome by 11:30am.

<u>Corvettes on the Boardwalk</u> – Jerry Lelansky reminded everyone that this year's event takes place on October 12-13th, as usual, in Ocean City, MD – and is sponsored by Free State Corvette Club. It has become a popular NVCC tradition and between 10-12 NVCC members have registered. Jerry also briefed everyone on arrangements for NVCC members to meet for lunch as well as dinner on both days.

<u>Teen Driving School</u> – NVCC will not sponsor a Fall TDS this year; however, our Club members are encouraged to help BMW at their October 21st event in Waldorf, MD.

Other Ideas, comments

Reunion with past presidents; update the Club trailer; return to the track

- 50th Anniversary Events in 2019: 5 Major Events are planned so far, as follows: Annual NVCC Banquet January 26; NVCC's Annual Car Show June 2; NVCC at NCM 7/17 thru 7/19; Corvettes at Carlisle August 22 thru 25; Corvette Weekend on the Boardwalk October 4&5.
- <u>Club Photo for Blue Bars</u> Mike Gilliland announced that 40-50 Corvettes are needed to form a "50" visual for an aerial photo. Gunston Hall is still the venue of choice for this Spring; however, we may also look into the possibility of a photo shoot at the Flying Aerodrome in Bealeton, VA.
- Corvettes at Carlisle Mike G. discussed the need to book a hotel as soon as possible for this very popular event. The Club will also host a hospitality tent that must be staffed on Thursday through Saturday so we need volunteers to help out. The tent will be marked on the event map and program and should be excellent publicity for NVCC. A poll was taken from the GBM audience and the following number of members plan to attend each day: Thursday, 14; Friday, 16; Saturday, 15 as a result, at least 20 rooms per night will be blocked for the Club.
- Rick Poage, 50th Anniversary Committee Chair, closed the 50th Anniversary discussions with the following announcements:

We may have a Spring and a Fall event at Dominion Raceway. These will feature a slalom for one, and autocross for another.

Steve Britt, owner of Dominion Raceway, will be a guest speaker at the October GBM

<u>Fall Foliage Cruise (October 27th)</u> – George Durk announced that he will reprise the cruise from earlier this year, to Seneca Rocks via Old WV Route 55.

<u>Trivia</u> – Jeff Klain, NVCC historian, led the following trivia:

Two weeks ago, my son and I visited the Smithsonian Museum of American History. Today's questions are based on that museum's current displays and all three vehicles are currently within about 100 feet of each other. Good luck!

Name the exceptionally rare but famous General Motors sporty two seat car that was produced from 1996 to 1999 and was the subject of a 2006 documentary film. *Answer: EV1*

Maybe this car was destined to be the American Porsche 911 because it featured a horizontally opposed six-cylinder rear mounted engine. It appeared about 5 years before the first Corvette. While only 51 cars were produced, the one in the Smithsonian bears serial number 1039. After years hidden in Smithsonian storage, #1039 was finally placed on public display in the Museum of American History in 2011. It was acquired by the Smithsonian through the U.S. Marshals Service which had previously seized the car in a 1992 narcotics arrest. Instead of selling the car, the U.S. Marshals Service decided to donate the car to the Smithsonian. What is it? *Answer: Tucker Torpedo*

In California of the late 1970s, if you were speeding in your Corvette, you might be pulled over by this four-cylinder double overhead cam vehicle which was made famous by Erik Estrada and Larry Wilcox in a popular TV series. Name the vehicle. *Answer: Kawasaki 1000C1*

Locked Out, Again

I had been attacking the treadmill in the gym strenuously enough that when I came out I was still pretty warm. So, along with my gym bag, I put my winter coat into the trunk. It wasn't until I closed the "hatch" that I realized the fob was in that coat, not my sport coat. Although the body is mostly fiberglass, evidently the trunk compartment isn't, so the radio waves didn't reach the receiver and the trunk release button wouldn't work.

After pounding my forehead a few times, I remembered that one of OnStar's features is that they can remotely unlock the doors. Fortunately, my cell phone was in my pocket, not in the coat in the car, and I had previously programmed in their phone number, so I gave them a call. After a few questions to verify that I was not actually a car thief, ¹ they sent a signal to unlock the doors.

It was really eerie – there was no sound, but the lights blinked and I could now open the door, and from inside I could open the trunk, retrieve the fob and drive away.

Update: When I once again accidentally locked the key in the trunk, although this time in the next generation 2017 Corvette Sting Ray. I remembered reading that the trunk lid was now fiberglass, and even that one could affix an EZ-Pass transmitter underneath. This is significant for those of us who had ordered the Performance Data Recorder – basically a dash cam on steroids – that now may be blocked if the transmitter were placed in the previous location.

So I tried the trunk release button before calling OnStar, and it popped open. One less thing to worry about.

However, it's been replaced by another! To open the gas cap one no longer has to push a button inside the car, only press the back of the cap, when it will pop open – except when it doesn't!

When the electromechanical switch fails, unlike the mechanical alternatives provided for inoperative door locks, <u>from both the inside and the outside the car</u>, there is none!

Fortunately, one owner in desperate straits found that prying at the top and bottom of the gas cap <u>will pop off what is just a snap-on cover</u>, exposing the inner workings, from where the errant pin can be dislodged. I now carry a screwdriver of a size that can accomplish this, should the need arise.

¹ Actually, even knowing the correct answers, a thief would only be able to gain entry – OnStar can't also remotely start the car. I queried them about this after an occasion when I hadn't noticed that a restaurant valet hadn't left the fob in car as usual, and we had stopped at a grocery store miles away on the way home. Fortunately, when my wife went inside to buy

NVCC ELECTED OFFICERS – Elected Annually in November

Per By-Laws enacted in October 2017

GENERAL: NVCC officers are elected for periods of one year, not to exceed three years.

PRESIDENT

The President conducts NVCC meetings and supervises official NVCC functions and activities. The President has signature authority (along with Treasurer) on Club checking account, deposits all funds within ten calendar days of receipt, and may access any Club safety deposit box, post office box, and Club charge card. The President instructs the Officer-at-Large to temporarily fill any vacated officer position for a period not to exceed 90 calendar days. The President supports the Vice President as needed, to ensure that appointed committee groups carry out responsibilities. The President is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

VICE PRESIDENT

The Vice President assumes the duties and responsibilities that the President is unable or incapable of performing. The Vice President oversees activities of all NVCC committees and is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

SECRETARY

The Secretary records minutes of all NVCC meetings and keeps a written copy for future reference. The Secretary prepares official correspondence and other written material deemed necessary by NVCC's council, to include business meeting minutes, Council minutes, attached Treasurer's Reports, and by-laws. The Secretary preserves all records and correspondence and maintains an inventory of current login information (i.e., user ids and passwords) for all systems and/or websites used by NVCC. The Secretary is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

TREASURER

The Treasurer is responsible for the receipt, care, and disbursement of NVCC funds. The Treasurer prepares a monthly financial report to be made public at monthly business and Council meetings and has signature authority (along with President) on Club checking account, deposits all funds within ten calendar days of receipt, and may access any Club safety deposit box, post office box, and Club charge card. The Treasurer provides nametags for new members and fulfills additional orders. The Treasurer is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

OFFICER-AT-LARGE

The Officer-At-Large will be familiar with the duties and responsibilities of all NVCC officers, and able to temporarily (not to exceed 90 calendar days) assume those duties as needed. The Officer-At-Large acts as Parliamentarian at meetings and is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.


