### **NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES**




### NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM By: NCM Ambassador Dick Hammaker












### REMEMBER WHEN..... NVCC Was in Vette Vues Magazine — 1995





Northern Virginia Corvette Clubs' NCCC Sanctioned 17th Annual "Concours" was held Sunday, May 7, 1995 at Koon's Chevrolet/Geo, Tysons Corner, Va (our sponsor). The dealership opened at 8:00 a.m. to blue skies and mild temperatures, to reach the mid-70's during the day. Already, cars were lined up and waiting in the tech inspection line; slated to begin at 8:30 a.m. This was just a preview of things to come.

In 1994 NVCC had approx. 25+ cars due to poor weather for our annual Concours. 1995, with much more lead time for planning and advertising, plus the very cooperative weather, brought in a total of 66 cars registered. This included some 10-12 Vettes in a new class for us - exhibition - where the cars were not judged, but voted upon by the public for "people's choice" award.

The show room was packed full of Vettes ranging from a 1959 Fuelie, 2 '63 split windows and 7 ZRI's, one for every year they were produced and a Callaway Twin Turbo, surrounding a 1995 Pace Car replica. Behind the show room were 4 large service lanes full of Vettes, side by side with the overflow (25 non-preregistered cars showing up Sunday morning) displayed in the parking lot in front of the building. Also, 10 different Corvette Clubs were represented from North Carolina to Pennsylvania. Over 25 NVCC members volunteered to support the show and 16 members placed a Vette in the Concours.

Early afternoon brought the judging to completion and "Best of Show" and "Best Concours Prepared" awards went to our own John Ventura "the boss waxer" with his 40th Anniversary '93 ZR-1 (Ruby Red).

There were smiles aplenty as the participants admired their trophies and prepared for the trip home. Shortly the lot, bays, and the showroom were empty leaving the 1995 Pace Car as the lonely remaining Vette.

Our 17th Annual Concours was over for another year and all the planning and hardwork raised approximately \$2,000 for our charities, the Duke Pediatic Cancer Center and the Association of Retarded Citizens (ARC).

We couldn't ask for a more enthusiastic sponsor than Koon's Chevy-Geo. They have been very supportive of NVCC, including donating a conference room for our meetings. The show room and front parking areas were cleared of dealership cars as well as the entire service area for our show. Koon's also supplied free hot dogs and drinks for everyone. Their professional staff went out of their way to make the 17th Concours show a success!
