# 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Photo Shoot at Gunston Hall April 7, 2019

Mike Gilliland came up with a perfect location for our 50th Anniversary photo shoot at Gunston Hall. He chose Gunston Hall because of its history. It was home to George Mason IV, a founding father, senior statesman, author of the Virginia Declaration of Rights, and he was among the first to call for such fundamental American liberties as religious toleration and freedom of the press. Additionally, the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the United States, and the Bill of Rights were all influenced by George Mason's political perspectives.

Mike, Jerry and Russell Cestone worked for a few months getting the needed TSA clearances, waiver letters and web forms submitted to allow us to fly the drones in what's considered the "No Fly" area.

The weather was very good, starting out in the mid 50's and quickly warmed up to the upper 60's and slightly overcast.

The "support team" arrived about 9:15am to determine the parking sequence and to layout the "50" and extra rows to park the 39 Corvettes that showed up. The support staff included: Jerry, who worked out six different layouts to account for various number of cars that may show up, from 22 to 45 Corvettes; Mike Gilliland, Dick Hammaker, Jim Dobish and Jerry did the measurements and right angles for the parking; John Stark figured out the layout sequence; Marsha Batchellor, John Scott, Shawn Waddell and Kevin Van Sloten helped with parking; and Irene Lelansky ensured everyone signed the waiver, collected the money and made sure Gunston Hall was paid.

Everyone else started rolling in around 9:45am and had time to chat while the team finalized the layout. The group started lining up around 10:30 and finished parking at 11:30. We had two drone pilots taking pictures: Nate Richards, who is in the same drone club with a guy that worked with Mike, and Russell Cestone, Paul's son.

Following the photo shoot most everyone went to Glory Days Grill in Lorton.

# NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

The meeting began at 7:30 pm at Page Chevrolet in Alexandria, VA and was presided over by Mike Gilliland, President. Past presidents attending were Dick Hammaker, John Palmgren, and Rick Poage. New members present were: Alex McKay and Bob and Karen Shoemaker. Prospective Members present were: Rafael Ludo. All members introduced themselves.

Approval of Minutes: The February 2019 minutes were approved.

### National Corvette Museum Guest – Amy Hardin

Amy Hardin, Development and Sponsorship Manager, from the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY gave an interesting and informative speech about the museum. She opened by stating that she did not have any information about the new Corvette C-8. She also stated the museum in not affiliated with General Motors and is a 501c3. She covered events planned soon such as the Michelin Bash, 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Museum, the 24-Hour LeMans and Kentucky 1-Lap. See the museum's website for details. Other news at the museum includes the renovations of the gateway/admissions area and the search for a new executive director since the present executive director, Wendell Strode, is retiring.

Amy also reviewed present and future fundraising activities for the museum.

The "sisterhood" is a collaborative group that pulls together gifts for the museum. In this way, larger items can be donated since donations are pooled.

Corvette clubs can have their logo on tabletops in the café. After three years, tables are returned to the sponsoring club.

The museum is working on raffles outside of Kentucky.

The National Corvette Museum has 34,000 to 35,000 members in all 50 states and several foreign countries.

No date has been set for the plant to reopen. It has been closed since 2017 for re-tooling and to install a new paint shop.

Amy closed her speech with door prizes and thanked the club for inviting her to attend. Members enjoyed her informative and enthusiastic presentation. The club thanked Amy by presenting her with an NVCC wine glass.






NVCC's 50th Anniversary Caravan to NCM is coming together. I've been working with NCM to finalize the agenda.






# A PRELUDE TO BOWLING GREEN By George Durk

Bowling Green is abeckoning NVCC!

The Eastern Region National Conference of Corvette Clubs (ERNCCC) had its special track day event at the Na-



tional Corvette Museum on April 11. The track event was free for ER NCCC due to a \$15,000 contribution made to the museum several years back. What a fantastic time!



There were several of us participating from NVCC including Stewart and Carol Fox ('16 Artic White Coupe), Rita and Richard Mars ('13 Velocity Yellow Coupe), John Palmgren ('06 Lemans Blue Coupe), Paul Benish ('00 Black Coupe) and myself and Merce ('14 Night Race Blue Coupe).

When we arrived at the hotel Wednesday early evening, it was like bees starting to swarm around a nest as

Corvettes started to fill the parking lot. The weather was perfect — clear and sunny mid-70s. Of course, the corvette camaraderie was instantaneous, admiring one another's pride and joy while undergoing inspections for the following day. Several other clubs from our area were well-represented including Free State and Belair. Also, York County PA Corvette Club had a significant contingent.



At 7:30 the following morning we were at the track facility for the briefings on safety and protocol for the event. There were approximately 70 drivers at all levels (beginner, intermediate and advanced). We started with the advanced drivers (primarily instructors) leading several rounds of alternate pace laps for beginners and intermediates. What a great feeling of excitement to put the drive mode in track and then experience this thoroughbred for the purpose it was built! The track is 3.2 miles long with 23 curves and front and back straights as well. I hit 105 on the front straight and wasn't close to the fastest!

Once we became familiar with the track doing pace laps, the groups alternated 30-minute track time between no-pass and pass runs. It was an ideal arrangement — do your 30-minutes, rest, then go back out for another pass or no-pass session. Or, stay out and do consecutive sessions! Stewart Fox volunteered to manage and instruct on the figure-8 skid pad. I was iffy on the skid pad thinking about having to clean the car. But, towards the end of the afternoon, I relented and wasn't disappointed. Stewart is a seasoned track guru and instructor.





On Friday there was a guided tour of the museum and optional visits to an air and train museum. Merce and I went back to the museum later in the day to spend more time and really take in the history. On behalf of the club,

Stewart, John and Paul made it a point to visit the Ken Novinger memorial bench the club helped sponsor in 2014. Ken was an instructor who died at Summit Point in an unfortunate accident.

I'm really looking forward to returning to the museum in July for more pace laps, museum tour and the club's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary brick dedication. The highways in western Maryland and West Virginia are mountainous and twisty and in good shape, including Kentucky, with 70 mph speed limits – perfect for a Corvette caravan. Who knows, maybe the C8, which will have been revealed a few days prior to our visit, will be on display?
