



RON FELLOWS PERFORMANCE DRIVING SCHOOL WORTH THE TRIP!

If you bought a new Corvette within the last year and haven't taken advantage of the discounted track rate at Ron Fellows, you're missing one of the best benefits of your new car! And even if it's been more than a year since you bought your new car or you bought a used car some time ago, the full-price course is definitely one I would recommend!

For those 'old timers' who haven't heard (or you new members that I've only had the pleasure of meeting virtually), Jack and I decided that my 60th Birthday last year was definitely the time to splurge on a brand new 2018 Stingray! Having driven 'other people's problems' for 40 years with the 79 Rose through Rose IV, Rose V is a Long Beach Red (or as I lovingly call it 'Lone Star Red') Metallic Stingray with the Z51 package.



I finally got over the fact that the C7 looks like a souped-up Camaro, and with the new C8 on the horizon, it was now or never!



Although I've dabbled in NCCC-sanctioned autocrosses and drag races for years, I've never been to an official driving school. Since Jack and I both love the new car, we took advantage of the cooler spring weather to attend the Ron Fellows school in April, which is only \$1,000 for the first year after purchase instead of the usual \$2,500. That includes 2 days of instruction and track time (in their cars!), one night's lodging in their on-site condos (with kitchenette) overlooking the track, and breakfast & lunch for both track days. You can also reserve an extra night if you come in the night before for about \$175 + tax (total about

\$190.75). This is definitely also worth it, so you're fresh & relaxed starting out. Your spouse can attend all the class-room sessions, drive with the instructor, and enjoy all the meals for only an extra \$40! Definitely recommended! Note that, since you'll be driving their cars, you are liable for \$8,000 in damages if you wreck the car (\$15K if it's a

ZR1), but can buy that down to \$2,000 for \$200 worth of insurance.

Each day is a mix of classroom instruction then heading out to the track to practice what you've learned. Our class was 12 people. After the initial laps around the track, the class is broken down into smaller groups of similar ability of 2 or 3 cars, each with its own instructor, so you get maximum personal instruction. On the track, the instructors communicate with two-way radios, and everyone gets to rotate as leader around one of three 10-turn tracks. You'll also practice on a





wet skid pad, ovals, and autocross-type cone turns (with the windshield blocked!). They will also give you a once-over on all the new gizmos and gadgets on your new C7 (including where to jump-start the car without having to dig through the hatch for the battery!). Throughout the two days, there are plenty of snacks, drinks, and comfort breaks. On day two, a photographer will be out taking awesome pictures as you navigate the turns that you can purchase — all the pictures on a USB stick for about \$150. Plus they do awesome acrylic pictures on wood in several sizes (I got a 12" x 18" for about \$200). He gives a 15% military/first responder/veteran's discount that put me over the purchase edge! You'll also want to buy the

\$30 document frame for your certificate and your badge to hang on your wall. Plus lots of other fun items (shirts, shoes, hats, mugs) are available in the gift shop in the Welcome Center.

An awesome 'freebie' is the car's Performance Data Recorder – even if your personal car doesn't have this amazing option, you can bring (or buy) a 16 GB or 32 GB SD card & all of your track exercises will be recorded for you to

play back at home and analyze – complete with video, audio, gas/braking analysis, lap times, and more!

For dinner, we did the wine tasting at the Pahrump Valley Winery, followed by dinner in their restaurant (Symphony's) the first night, which was a awesome & definitely recommended before they turn all that into a casino! During the class, the track Clubhouse offers a great dinner for only \$10-\$12! The Clubhouse also has a full fitness center, pool, & whirlpool, with racquetball courts also available.





Spring Mountain Motor Resort and Country Club is about an hour's drive west and north into the desert from Las Vegas, in Pahrump, so you will need a rental car. Be sure to plan driving time to and from the track. And maybe spend some time in Vegas before or after the class. Note that ZR1 courses run less frequently, cost slightly more, but offer the same great benefits!! For more information, visit www.racespringmountain.com.




