




NVCC GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES

August 27, 2019— Jerry Lelansky, Acting Secretary

Officers Present: Mike Gilliland, President

John Scott, Vice President Jerry Lelansky, Officer at Large

Mike Gilliland (President) started the meeting at 7:30PM with introductions for new members.

Agenda

Five new members introduced themselves. Mike had to cut the introductions short because we have a full agenda.

August GBM minutes approved.

Vince and James (Page Chevorlet) discussed their current technician status.

John McGee is 90% gone, but he will help out one day a week.

Repairs/service: the best course of action they have is James, service foreman, and their VA State inspector/new and used car technician; both men are certified to work on Corvettes. The latest technician they hired is/was the Cadillac CTS-V technician. For those that don't know, the CTS-V is sometimes referred to as a four-door Corvette, because its supercharged V8 is from the Corvette C7 Z06, but with 10 less HP.

Vince reminded us that we get one free alignment, any car, per year. Also, we get 20% on service and parts (up to \$200) used during service on any car we bring in; we get 25% off parts at the parts counter on most, but not all, parts.

If you have a large repair, please see Vince on pricing as he can help us out.

Show our club magnetic name tag for the discount; they don't know everyone on sight and/or don't always see the club decal on your car.

If you have any issues with membership discounts, please see Vince.

Vince and James fielded questions from the membership:

Parts for the C5 are getting difficult to find. What can Page offer? Page has alternative sources and if it's not a GM part they will tell us first before ordering.

Can Page work on a 1966, specifically alignment? Yes, and most likely James will work on it, as he's more familiar with the older Corvettes than the others, unless it's a big project.

Do we have to call Vince for service? No, any of the service advisors are capable. If you want, you can ask for Vince.

What do we do if the have ANY issues/problems/miscommunications with our cars? Please see or call Vince.

Recently, there was an issue with the VA State inspector that started with "hockey pucks" and escalated. Vince apologized to the members and said that we are welcome to talk to the service technicians, but asked that we come to Vince or James. He also asked that we be respectful of the technicians. Vince and James also stated that all their lifts have foot pads/discs, which are better than using hockey pucks.

Two council positions are open for 2020. The first opportunity to suggest/volunteer is during the October GBM. Nominations will happen during the November GBM. The positions are:

Vice President - John Scott's three years are up.

Officer At Large – Jerry and Irene are moving out of the area early in 2020.

Below are quick descriptions of each of the NVCC elected positions.

Please consider volunteering for either (or any) position; all the elected positions are rewarding and your input and ideas can help make our club even better.

Jerry Lelansky

Northern Virginia Corvette Club Officer at Large (OAL)

NVCC ELECTED OFFICERS – Elected Annually in November

Per By-Laws enacted in October 2017

GENERAL: NVCC officers are elected for periods of one year, not to exceed three years.

PRESIDENT

The President conducts NVCC meetings and supervises official NVCC functions and activities. The President has signature authority (along with Treasurer) on Club checking account, deposits all funds within ten calendar days of receipt, and may access any Club safety deposit box, post office box, and Club charge card. The President instructs the Officer-at-Large to temporarily fill any vacated officer position for a period not to exceed 90 calendar days. The President supports the Vice President as needed, to ensure that appointed committee groups carry out planning and related responsibilities. The President is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

VICE PRESIDENT

The Vice President assumes the duties and responsibilities that the President is unable or incapable of performing. The Vice President oversees activities of all NVCC volunteer chair/committee(s) and is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

SECRETARY

The Secretary records minutes of all NVCC meetings and keeps a written copy for future reference. The Secretary prepares official correspondence and other written material deemed necessary by NVCC's council, to include business meeting minutes, Council minutes, attached Treasurer's Reports, and by-laws. The Secretary preserves all records and correspondence and maintains an inventory of current login information (i.e., user ids and passwords) for all systems and/or websites used by NVCC. The Secretary is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

TREASURER

The Treasurer is responsible for the receipt, care, and disbursement of NVCC funds. The Treasurer prepares a monthly financial report to be made public at monthly business and Council meetings and has signature authority (along with President) on Club checking account, deposits all funds within ten calendar days of receipt, and may access any Club safety deposit box, post office box, and Club charge card. The Treasurer provides nametags for new members and fulfills additional orders. The Treasurer is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

OFFICER-AT-LARGE

The Officer-At-Large will be familiar with the duties and responsibilities of all NVCC officers, and able to temporarily (not to exceed 90 calendar days) assume those duties as needed. The Officer-At-Large acts as Parliamentarian at meetings and is expected to attend NVCC general business meetings and council meetings.

NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM

Retiring Wendell Strode Selected to Corvette Hall of Fame

During the Corvette Hall of Fame banquet held on August 30, 2019, as part of the National Corvette Museum's 25th Anniversary celebration, NCM Board Chairman, Lon Helton, spoke to the 1,050 guests in attendance about reaching this milestone year. He shared his optimism for the future and expressed his gratitude for retiring Executive Director Wendell Strode.

"Wendell, your 23 years of service to the NCM could never be [overstated]. A few years after it opened, the NCM fell on some pretty tough times, to the point where I think that its very existence was threatened. Not only did you rescue the NCM—you led it to the prosperity that we enjoy today."

He then went on to make a surprise announcement. "As we prepare to meet the 2019 inductees to the Hall of Fame... it is my pleasure to announce to you that the 2020 class of the Corvette Hall of Fame will include Wendell Strode."

The crowd showed their support with a thunderous standing ovation.

This honor is well-deserved, as Wendell was involved in getting the National Corvette Museum going when it was still just an idea.

In 1988, word had spread that the National Corvette Restorers Society had been exploring the idea of building a Corvette Museum. Strode, a banker at the time, contacted the local Chamber of Commerce with an idea to initiate a proposal to have it built in Bowling Green, Kentucky. He then found himself heading up a task force, bringing to the table an offer of a 30-acre land donation from private citizens, and a commitment from the State of Kentucky to put in the road and utilities. Strode also worked with the NCRS to put together a financial package that included a feasibility study to get banks interested in joining the effort.

The Museum opened Labor Day weekend 1994 with much fanfare, but the excitement was short-lived as it soon began experiencing financial troubles. Strode was recruited to join the National Corvette Museum as Executive Director on December 20, 1996. At the time, he had never even driven a Corvette and had only ridden in one once. While he didn't know much about the car itself, what he did know was how to save its new home.



Strode worked to develop new strategies for generating funds, while making strides to repair strained relationships with the community, clubs, enthusiasts, media, the Plant, and GM. During his tenure, the Museum not only paid off its initial debt, but it nearly doubled its size, adding a world-class motorsports facility to its facilities. Under his leadership Museum membership grew from 1,600 enthusiasts to almost 36,000 members today. He even managed to survive a Corvette-swallowing sinkhole and helped to turn the attention it brought into a chance to share the Museum with a global audience.

The 2020 Corvette Hall of Fame recipients will be inducted during a ceremony and banquet held on Friday, September 4, 2020. Additional inductees will be announced at a later date. Their induction will take place as part of the Museum's 26th Anniversary Celebration, scheduled for September 3-5, 2020.

October 13 Lunch and Cruise to The Flying Circus in Bealeton, VA



Bob Devery's fall outing evolved into a smashing event! Originally planned as a repeat of last year's picnic and airshow, the small turnout of seven precluded renting the pavilion, so he needed to improvise, with a little help from the Club's Fauquier County expert. Bob and Carol Devery, George and Mercedita Durk, Joanna Hicks and Kris McCandless, and "newer member" Jim Mooney met up just off Route 66 at the Cracker Barrel in Manassas on Sunday morning, October 13, showing a theme of light and dark Vettes. We cruised to the Black Bear Bistro for a great lunch (brunch for some!) in

downtown Warrenton. For those that remember my license plate, you'll know

why everyone chuckled at the idea of a place with a bear logo! It was ultra cool with great decor and very good food. If you need a pitstop in the Warrenton area, it's a good place to enjoy a good meal or brickoven pizza. I then led a spirited drive down a few back roads and into The Flying Circus. The quick trip to Bealeton gave us plenty of time to park and then take a look at the aircraft that would be in the show. The Stearman biplanes were built in the 1930s as World War II trainers. The dedicated team at the Flying Circus keeps these aircraft flying as

to war, such as target practice with balloons at low altitude, slicing a roll of paper towels at 2000 feet (amazing you can actually see the whole roll against the clouded sky AND the individual pieces), grabbing the mailbag, and bombing the "black baron in the outhouse" with pancake mix! We also enjoyed wing walking on one of the biplanes, but the way this show differed from last fall was we had two high performance planes taking our breath away with amazing aerobatic maneuvers.





The first was by a four-cylinder, 360 cubic inch, fuel-injected, carbon -fiber-propellered biplane, (one you could order and build in your garage!), flown by Chef Pitts (the small plane shown in red) who wowed us with up to six barrel rolls, numerous full spins, aileron and torque rolls, and hammerhead stalls with speeds up to 200 mph (sort of like Cassidy, but up in the air in this Corvette-like airplane!).

We thought we had seen it all until a NXT Sport Race category aircraft with speeds in excess of 300 mph came on the scene and did full upside down flybys, large diameter loops, and long distant stalls, all accented with different colored smoke from the wingtips. Due to speed of this plane, it could not land in the grass at the Circus, but both stunt pilots came to the show to sign autographs. The seven of us left at 5 pm feeling so happy and proud of our nation's flying history and innovation. The Flying Circus is a place that has been giving people a wonderful look at aviation for 49 years.
