
It was a group effort that turned out to be a very memorable "fond farewell".






enjoy the twisties as you enter the Shenandoah National Park after passing through Sperryville. We started from

The Mimslyn Inn's winter brunch is \$18.95. Add a drink (coffee, tea or soda, etc.), tax and tip and it's between \$25 -\$30 all in. They do change the theme of the brunch and price. So, be sure to check their website or call beforehand. Also, we decided to call and make a reservation during our drive there. Not a bad idea.

After brunch, visit Luray Caverns or the antique car museum right next to it (free) and/or take Rt 675/678 (Fort Valley Rd) towards Front Royal and enjoy lots of nice twisties and country landscapes. It'll help burn off some of the calories! If you can interrupt your driving fun, there's a popular lookout up in the mountains - nice photo opp. It takes about an hour from Luray to Front Royal via Rt 675/678. Thanks to Randy Taylor, we discovered Two Fat Butchers in Front Royal. It's now our tradition to stop and stock up on some beef jerky and other staples.

It's about 15-minutes to interstate 66 from Two Fat Butchers and you're entering Centreville area within an hour.

I'm really starting to appreciate winter drives. When we got home, no insects plastered on my windshield or bumper - just saying! However, that won't stop us from taking this Sunday outing again and enjoying the beauty of each Virginia season.





Greetings Fellow NVCC'ers,

One of the few activities I've been able to enjoy during this shut-down is taking the Vette out into the country. Each weekend, a few of us have met and headed west into the mountains. I hope you have been out and about in your Vette as well.

Here's a suggestion for a nice WV country outing. Since the club is not sponsoring any official activities, take a solo excursion or ask a couple of fellow club members to join.

This is a general outline of the way I would go. Of course, modify accordingly.

Old WV 55 Towards Moorefield

Head out on I-66 West to I-81 North. Take exit 307 (Stephens City) — it's less than 10-minutes after merging onto I-81. Left at exit ramp light and turn into Sheetz (on the left) for a rest stop.

Left turn out of Sheetz and take Rt 631 to T. Make another left and take Rt 628. Bear right at end of Rt 628 and you're now on Rt 48 (Corridor H), which leads into Wardensville.

Optional Stop — Lost River Trading Post in Wardensville (going or coming back). Interesting place with unique collectibles, art, wines, coffees, sandwiches, etc. And, of course, rest room.

Old WV 55 is an awesome twisty country road (approximately 25 miles). You'll pick it up as you're leaving the outskirts of Wardensville. Be alert - it's on the right and sneaks up fast. Turn right onto Old WV 55 towards Moorefield and enjoy. You can do the speed limit (or a little above) and enjoy the curves. There's lots of unpopulated sections of road. Of course, suggested speed for curves don't apply to Corvettes!

Stay on Old WV 55. Ignore the signs for taking Rt 48/55 to Moorefield. That's the new Corridor H road.

Eventually, you'll come to a T. Make a left and you're a few miles from the outskirts of Moorefield. Make a right onto Main St and in about a half-mile you'll see a new Sheetz on the left. Rest stop/food. There's also a McDonalds, Burger King and a few other fast food restaurants around to order out.

Calculating rest stop at Sheetz in Stephens City, it's around two and half hour drive.

Moorefield to Blackwater Falls State Park (Davis, WV)

From Moorefield it's only about 40-45 minutes to Blackwater Falls. Take Rt 48 W (intersection near Sheetz) for 40 miles. It's the new Corridor H – beautiful and well-maintained road. It turns into Rt 93. When you come to the T, make left on Rt 32

(Appalachian Hwy) for about ½ mile. Then make right onto Rt 29 (Blackwater Falls Rd) for 1.4 miles. You'll see the signs for Blackwater Falls (left on Canyon Point Rd).

The last time I checked, WV State Parks are still open. Although park ranger and tourist buildings are closed.

Take your time and head down to the Falls - social distancing of course. It's easier going down to the Falls than heading back up - take even more time!

Head back to Sheetz in Moorefield for another rest stop.

Moorefield back to Northern VA

Make a right onto Main St and head back via Old WV 55. You'll eventually come to the end. Make a left, which will take you into Wardensville.

Or, take the new Rt 48/55 E (Corridor H) which ends in Wardensville as well.

Bear right as you're leaving Wardensville onto Rt 48. It'll lead to I-81. Cross over I-81 and make left to go North and a few miles up it merges onto I-66.

If you leave around 10:00 am, you should be home by 6:00 or 6:30.

I attended the Instructor Summit Indy in Indianapolis, IN at the Silo Auto Club. Part museum, winter storage, and social car club!

What a great time with over 140 new friends. The Instructor Summit - Indy was geared toward HPDE Instructor development with many concepts discussed and ideas shared - that will help both instructors and non-instructing drivers as well.

Instructors and and drivers arrived from clubs all over the US. There certainly was a wide range of experiences our attendees brought to the table----instructors learning from other instructors.

Greg Haas from Summit Point Raceway also attended and contributed to several of the discussions.

I had supporting roles for the summit with responsibility for publishing and then summarizing a Pre-Summit Questionnaire. It was answered by 114 respondents.

I also had the chance to speak to the audience about managing "challenging students" using a metaphor of "what color is your stomach?" - how are you feeling with your student? I used yellow, orange, and red. The basic philosophy is that if you are not comfortable, don't wait - please pull your student into the pits and talk to the Chief Instructor about your student. I related a few of my incidents, others in the audience provided some of their lessons learned. This was well received.

I will be working with Hooked on Driving this summer and expect to be at Summit Point several times this season. Hope everyone is doing well!





Debuting on Tuesday, March 24 around 4pm CT with new episodes on Tuesdays and Thursdays.


WHERE:


