A tropical depression hit lower Texas the weekend before and its remnants travelled up into the central states. A cold front dipped into the mid-Atlantic arriving early Tuesday with rain, and then beautiful, seasonal weather. The cool, dry and sunny weather remained through the rest of the week and into our weekend. Morning temps in Marion, our home base, were around 40 and rose to highs of around 65 during the day. But, with the sun, clear skies, and no wind, it was absolutely beautiful! Also, an unexpected surprise was the leaves starting to turn gold already.

Given all the trials and tribulations of 2020, I felt an extra sense of excitement about escaping for a long weekend into the mountains with to travel as one group until we arrived at The our Corvettes. Meeting at the Cracker Barrel in Manassas, some of us enjoyed a casual lunch. After some photos, introductions, waiver signing and drivers meeting, we were off by 2:00.

What an attractive Corvette caravan! We had 10 cars embark from our starting point – 1 C8, 2 C7 Z06s, 3 C7 Stingrays, and 4 C6s, including a Grand Sport. Four cars (2 C6s, C7 Grand Sport and a Nissan 350Z) met us at the hotel.

With the help of Waze, and after a few rest stops along the way, we arrived at the General Francis Marion hotel, with its renovated 1920s themed ambience, around 7:30. The hotel lobby restaurant, Waterlily, was quite surprised when NVCC packed its tables for a late evening surge of business around 8:00. The entrees were very good as well – the chef is definitely top-notch.

Our first day began at 9:30 with a drivers meeting in the hotel's breakfast room. The plan was Snake in Mountain City, TN, and then break into two groups. We were fortunate to have Mike Gilliland, our current el presidente, with invaluable experience as our sweeper, and prior el presidente, Rick Poage, also a certified track instructor, to lead the spirited drivers group.

It was a good plan, until we got separated. Unfortunately, I got a little carried away enjoying the twisties, and with the help of an interloper, the group missed a turn and there were only three of us left on the planned route. Thanks to Rick taking the lead, the rest of the group made it to Mountain City to enjoy the first half of The Snake on route 421 north, and we rendezvoused at our lunch stop in Shady Valley, TN.









After lunch, we separated into the planned groups and continued on the 2nd half of The Snake towards the South Holston Dam in Bristol, TN. The South Holston Lake and Dam is very picturesque and a nice way to "unwind" after tackling The Snake. We were able to drive on the dam and stop to take photos. We then continued on the planned route - back down the 2nd half of The Snake and toward home base in Marion via semitwisty country roads, of course. Once back at the hotel, it was time to relax – some of us enjoyed a drink at the bar – then, right across the street to Macado's for a delightful dinner! Thanks to Rich and Rita Mars and Jim Dobish for the suggestion.

Saturday was our Back of the Dragon ("BOD") day. Its theme is "eleven ... try thirty-two." Meaning, it has 32 miles of twisties compared to the infamous Tail of the Dragon's 11 miles.

After the drivers meeting, we embarked around 10:00 to "Slay the Dragon." The plan was to enjoy half of the dragon, then shoot east for 18 miles to Big Walker Lookout in Wytheville. It was awesome! We had no local traffic on the Dragon or going to and from Big Walker Lookout. It's a popular destination with a general store and captivating views of the valley at 3,400 feet. It also has a 100-foot tower to get even a better view. Rita Mars was our lone brave soul, who fearlessly climbed to the top!

We then headed back to complete the 2nd half of BOD toward the Welcome Center in Tazewell for lunch. As we turned into the Welcome Center, I noticed more bikes than usual. Then we heard a band playing. There was a complete row of parking spaces empty in the rear and the Vettes filled all 13 available spaces. Was this providence? The crowd outside listening to music nodded as our caravan of Vettes made their entrance. The owners of the Welcome Center also came out to greet us, explaining that it was their Octoberfest. What an added plus! We ordered lunch from the food truck, milled, browsed and shopped around and enjoyed the excellent band. Many enjoyed checking-out our cars as well.

After a few hours, we headed to Burkes Garden for another short stint. It's also in Tazewell and only about 20 minutes from the BOD Welcome Center. Burkes Garden was first surveyed in the 1740s and is the 2nd highest plateau in Virginia at 3,087 feet. Here's the official geography and geology description:

"The oval, bowl-like valley (or "cove") is known for its fertile land and was once the bed of an ancient sea. About 8.5 miles (13.7 km) long and 4 miles (6.4 km) wide, it resembles a large volcanic crater in satellite photographs and on topographic maps; however, it was formed when underground limestone caverns collapsed. The mountain valley is the second highest in Virginia at around 3,000 feet (910 m) above sea level and is completely surrounded by Garden Mountain. This unusual topography is similar to that of Canaan Valley in neighboring West Virginia."

More importantly, it's an amazingly twisty and fun 5-mile drive up the mountain to get to the valley. Once you're in the valley, it's also amazingly peaceful with fertile green pastures. We stopped at the General Store and did the loop around the valley.



A special GBM Brunch meeting held at the American Legion, Fairfax, was attended by many club members, who filled several tables at its outdoor balcony. The meeting commenced at 12:00 pm, presided by President Mike Gilliland.
