Lifetime members were invited to a "Sneak Peek" sampling of light hors d'oeuvres. Trust me, as a career foodie, his food is restaurant, not café quality.

Jack Matukas, Interim CEO, and Glenn Johnson, Chairman of the Board, opened the Bash with welcoming remarks. You could tell in their voices they were super stoked there was finally an in-person, on-site event. The Michelin Bash 2020 was totally virtual. This Bash was both virtual, with about 300 folks, and live warm bodies with about 1000 folks.

The first seminar of the Bash was Corvette mechanic Paul Koerner, GM World Class Certified Technician. His seminar focused on all aspects of the C7 including a question/answer session. The important takeaways were Paul's and GM's resource contact information.





As part of the Col-

lections, Exhibits, Library, and Archives Program, NCM acquired the old Fraternal Order of Police Lodge on the edge of the Museum's property. You've probably noticed the building on the right as you drive to the Motorsport Park.



Thanks to the generosity of the Chuck Fast family, the

building is now a Collection Campus where corvette artifacts can

be preserved, catalogued, and stored. Derek Moore, Director of Collections/Curator; Bob Bubnis, Associate Curator; and Leah

Craig, Registrar, held a virtual walkthrough and explained the functions of the numerous areas to include a Media Studio.

For those Kentucky One Lap (K1L) fans, Kentucky State Police (KSP) Trooper First Class Jonathan Biven was presented the largest ever check for KSP Trooper Island...\$38,000! Team Hammaker & Team McCandless were happy to have been a part of that donation and look forward to this year's K1L in October.






The highlight of the first day of the Bash was a Bowling Green Assembly Plant (BGAP) update by Kai Spande (Plant Manager), Nora Roper (Assistant Plant Manager), and Chuck Valentini (Paint & Body Manager).

Kai explained how 300 vehicle part suppliers, 1500 vehicle parts, 1400 employees with 600 jobs actually touching the vehicle all come together to assemble one Corvette every 11.7 hours with two shifts. It's beyond amazing!

Kai mentioned there is no date for public tours, discussed the export right hand drive C8, Green improvements to the Assembly Plant, and Community involvement.

Kai, representing GM, congratulated Mike Furman, Criswell Chevrolet of Gaithersburg, for being the No. 1 Corvette





Chuck Valentini introduced three new colors for 2022....Hypersonic Gray Metallic replacing Shadow Gray Metallic, Amplified Orange Tintcoat replacing Sebring Orange Tintcoat, and Caffeine Metallic replacing Zeus Bronze Metallic. The Team brought rear quarter panels painted in the new colors. To really appreciate the depth of the colors, they have to be seen in the sunlight.



The second day of the Bash was as action packed as the first with Mobil 1, Michelin, GM Corvette Teams, and a Live Auction of Corvette memorabilia.



The Mobil 1 Team focused on questions/answers from in-person as well as virtual participants. Questions concerned the new 0W40 oil for C6 through C8 and



when to change the oil. Mobil 1 presented a Mobil 1/NCM 2021 mid-engine Stingray for parades and publicity.

moted Vehicle Chief Engineer)....gave an update on 2021 options. It wasn't a surprise Torch Red was the most ordered color at 20% but it was a



surprise the Convertible's 41% selection rate was so high.

If you were interested in bidding at the live auction for significant Corvette memorabilia, bring a suit-case full of money!! Items, from signed lithographs, Corvette Cafe Glass Bricks, and a 50th Anniversary leather jacket to the 6' by 10' Corvette Museum Flag, were on the auction block. I had my eye on the Detroit Auto Show C8 Designers picture autographed by 16 of the Who's Who of the Corvette world. Unfortunately, I only brought a briefcase full of money and missed winning the Detroit Auto Show picture. The auction raised \$6,200 for the Museum.



Cruise in Great Falls from Cascades Overlook Plaza




Directions:

- then Turn left onto Georgetown Pike (Route 193)
- Immediately turn left onto Seneca Road (12)
- Follow the route direction on Page 1 from (11) to (1) in the reverse order as shown in blue — line-arrows.

Alternate Longer Direction, shown in brown ——line-arrows:

- 1) At (6), Continue on the Georgetown Pike, until Swanks Mill Road
- 2) Turn right onto Swanks Mill Road
- Go past Old Dominion Road, then Turn right onto Lewinsville Road (Route 694)
- 4) Continue on Route 694, then Turn right at Stop light onto Leesburg Pike (Route 7)
- 5) At the next Stop light Turn left onto Towlston Road, which changes into Trap Road
- Take over pass over 267 Toll Road, then turn left onto Trap Road
- 7) At Stop sign, Turn left onto Beulah Road NE
- 8) Continue past 267 Toll Road, then Turn left onto Leesburg Pike (Route 7) at Stop light
- 9) At the next Stop light, turn right onto Colvin Run Road
- Then Turn right onto Walker Road (Route 681)
- 11) Proceed to Walker Village (17), turning left onto the parking lot
- 12) Arrive at Great Falls Creamery, behind Old Brogue Irish Pub






PLEASE NOTE:
