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Our arrival time gave us the opportunity to meet some of the officers getting off the day shift while the evening shift was going through their roll call briefing. One item that is extremely noticeable these days is the amount of protective gear that the officers have to wear on a shift. The protective vest, radios, ammo clips, hand cuffs and other items end up being a total of roughly 20 pounds! Beth mentioned that during the warm weather, there are times where officers simply take a cup of water and pour it down the top of their uniform to cool off the heat from the vests. Along with all of the computer gear and more that is in the patrol car, just getting in and out of their vehicles can be a challenge. I offered a seat in my Corvette to a couple of the officers who chuckled and politely passed because of all the gear. Eventually, we were able to have officers from the day and evening shifts get out to look at our cars and engage in conversation. If you didn't know it, most of the officers are "car guys". They are very knowledgeable about what we drive as well as most other cars on the road. Many of them have had or currently own a high performance vehicle. One officer, in particular, wanted more info as she has been looking at the Grand Sport as well as Camaros. Of course, we tried to convince her ... GRAND SPORT! But, as we've seen, the prices on cars like mine have gone UP not down!! I've encouraged her to come to a meeting to talk with members about ideas as well as talk with the dealership. One FYI item ... It's interesting to note that many of the officers are not concerned about seeing our Corvettes being driven in an unsafe manner. They say that they realize that we as a group are not looked at as "street racers". The officers realize that we are aware that we drive either high performance or classic ... or both ... vehicles. We are not in the mindset to push the limits—except at the track! OK, and occasionally on a deserted road! But, only up to the posted speed limit (legalese provided for the protection of the club!).

In addition to some of the squad cars that pulled up after the day shift, Rich was able to bring one of the transport vans that they have. If you find yourself in the back of that one, you're not having a good day! As for the squad cars, it's amazing the amount of communication gear that they have in them. The officers on the ground have the ability to communicate with the helicopter squadron team in order to facilitate their actions to get to a location is rapidly as possible. As has been stated by officers AND smart members like Mr. Hammaker ... "You can't outrun Motorola"! A voice transmission from

one officer to another will beat any of our cars.

As always, it was great to see the officers and say THANK YOU for what they do. I have no idea why they want to stay on the job these days but I'm grateful that they do. The extreme majority of people get what they do and respect them but what we get told from officers on how they cannot enforce laws, etc., which makes it tough on protecting not only the community but themselves. A cousin of mine is NYPD. My Uncle/Godfather was NYPD. I can't share some stories in this format but I know that my cousin's life is truly in danger every day that he puts on his uniform but, sadly, in ways that my Uncle never imagined or thought would be possible. The men and women of Fairfax County Police are true professionals ... people of varied ages; religions; colors and political persuasion. They have a job which like the military, can cause them to pay the ultimate price for serving their community. It was nice to have conversation and laughs with them and to give them a break from the other parts of their day. THANKS to all of you who took time to participate ... the officers were truly grateful for the support.



The Black Hills Corvette Classic – Round Two By John Scott

July 2021 marked the 50th Anniversary of the Black Hills Corvette Classic (BHCC), an annual gathering of Corvettes from across the United States. The Sioux Falls (South Dakota) Corvette Club (SFCC) sponsors the event in one of the most scenic and historic regions of the United States. Vicki and I had attended the event in 2017, and the opportunity to participate in the 50th anniversary was just too good to pass up.

The BHCC itself ran from July 13-17, but as in 2017, we took a relatively leisurely time making our way to South Dakota. Leaving Friday, July 9, our four day outbound itinerary gave us the opportunity to stop for a few hours at the National Museum of the United States Air Force in Dayton, Ohio (July 10); and at my alma mater, the University of Iowa, in Iowa City (July 11). The Air Force Museum is a personal favorite for Vicki and me; we've visited museum four times now, and we still are nowhere near tired of seeing the exhibits. If you've already been there, you know what I mean; if you haven't, you should make time for a visit.



In Iowa City, we walked around the campus, and dropped by one of my old watering holes for a college-like lunch – burgers and beer. A lot has changed in Iowa City in the past 50 years, but some things have remained remarkably unchanged, including generous helpings of Iowa nice.

The BHCC event starts in Sioux Falls, the home base of the sponsoring club, on the eastern end of the state. We got to Sioux Falls the afternoon of July 12, and – after a relaxing evening at our hotel – headed south the morning of July 13 to Jerry's Chevrolet and Corvettes in Beresford, South Dakota (dealer sponsor of the host SFCC) for the initial meet and greet event to kick off the Classic. We pulled in to Jerry's a little after 10:00 a.m., and were parked in the front row of

what ultimately became 20 plus rows of some 600 Corvettes covering an area of more

than a city block. We went into the dealership, picked up our registration packet (which was chock full of information on the activities for the next few days), and headed out to listen to DJ-provided music, Corvette-related presentations, have a catered BBQ lunch, check out the cars, and get to know some of our fellow Corvette owners. It seemed

to Vicki and me that there were a lot more Corvettes at the welcoming event than there





had been four years before. As we talked to some of the sponsoring club's members that impression was confirmed; registrations and participation were substantially greater than they had expected. Around mid-afternoon we headed back to Sioux Falls to get ready for the nest day's Corvette caravan across to the Black Hills on the western end of the state.



hour or so on the final leg of the journey to stop at what may be the most advertised tourist stop in the United States – Wall Drug, in Wall, South Dakota. If you've never heard of Wall Drug, google it. There is literally something for everyone.


Pulling into Spearfish, home base for BHCC festivities about 5:00 p.m., we checked into our hotel, and got ready for the social mixer and kick off party at the Spearfish Holiday Inn Convention Center. First order of business for many (including yours truly) was to wash the rain and road grime off the cars. As they had done four years earlier, the SFCC had arranged with several of the local hotels to have washing stations with towels available. Drinks and a buffet dinner at the mixer and kickoff party were a great way to get to know more participants. Talking with members of the host SFCC, we learned that even more participants had shown up unexpectedly in Spearfish, making a total of more than 700 Corvettes.

Thursday morning (July 15) Vicki and I headed to down-town Spearfish for a little sightseeing and souvenir hunting. Spearfish is a picturesque small town, nestled in the northern end of the Black Hills, perfect for a few quiet

Wednesday, July 14 dawned rainy and ugly. Many participants, including Vicki and I. decided to forego the caravan, and make our way west separately. We managed a little sightseeing along the way, stopping in Mitchell to tour the "World's Only Corn Palace", a large event venue whose exterior is decorated entirely in multi-colored ears of corn; and on the outskirts of Chamberlain to see the Statue of Dignity, a 50-foot-tall statue of an Indian woman overlooking the Missouri river. After lunch at Al's Oasis, just across the Missouri, we continued our journey west. The weather had cleared by lunchtime, and we were able to take full advantage of the 80 mile-per-hour Interstate speed limit in South Dakota. Many BHCC participants, including Vicki and I, took an



hours of shopping and antiquing, and just enough off the beaten track to avoid the Black Hills tourist hoards. Shortly after lunch, we had our souvenir event photo taken, and lined up with roughly 70 other Corvettes for an afternoon run through Spearfish Canyon. Spearfish Canyon is rated as one of the ten best scenic drives in the U.S., and it is a great Corvette road. In 2017 the Spearfish Canyon drive took place early in the morning, with the rising sun just kissing the peaks on the west side of the Canyon. The mid-day drive through the deep cut canyon this year was a different, but no less awesome, experience. From Spearfish Canyon, we headed east to Lead and Deadwood for some more tourism. We drove up to Mt. Moriah Cemetery, the final resting place of old west luminaries Wild Bill Hickock and Calamity Jane. Then it was on to downtown Deadwood to join the tourist throngs.



Vicki and I headed to the southern Black Hills on Friday (July 16) to spend a little tourist time in Hill City and drive two iconic roads in the area. We headed south on Needles Highway, an amazing course on a narrow winding road through fantastic rock formations, to and through Custer State Park. It's a great road, but navigating it with oncoming SUVs, RVs and even buses is a bit of a challenge. We then headed north on Iron Mountain Road, with numerous switchbacks, over/under pigtail turns, and three tunnels that frame Mount Rushmore perfectly in the distance. Arriving back at our hotel, we freshened up and headed over to the Holiday Inn Convention Center to line up for the convoy into downtown Spearfish for Vette Street USA. The convoy into town was a mob scene, with Corvettes stretching more than a mile on the two lane road leading downtown. SFCC members worked for more than an hour to get everyone parked on Main Street. Main Street parking was limited to registered participants only, so the SFCC staff had their work cut out for them separating registered event goers from last minute participants.

The BHCC event wrapped up Saturday morning (July 17), with a breakfast awards banquet. A highlight of the banquet was a raffle to give away diamond necklaces donated by one of the event sponsors to 50 lucky winners. If there had been a "close but no cigar" award in the raffle, Vicki would have won it. Her raffle ticket number was 9464; two of the winning numbers were 9463 and 9465. You couldn't make this stuff up.

We began our journey back East on Sunday, July 17, but not before heading back to Wall for some last minute souvenir hunting and a trip through the Badlands. From there, it was on to visit family in Iowa for a few days before heading back to Williamsburg. There were lots of memorable moments on the trip, but the high point for me was seeing the look of pure joy on my 16 year old grand-nephew's face when I took him for a ride in the Z06, and let him drive it back to his uncle's house. Bragging rights for sure with his high school buddies, and he's got the pictures to prove it!

Some take-aways:

- The SFCC does a great job with the Black Hills event, but even they were surprised by the turnout. The combination of the 50th anniversary and a chance for people to finally try and put pandemic isolation in the mirror made for a huge crowd.
- There were many more tourists (not just Corvette people) in the Black Hills this year than Vicki and I remember from 2017. The event took place just as the Delta variant was really getting going, so things might have been more subdued if the Classic had been a month later with the Delta threat clearer.
- Or maybe not. The annual motorcycle rally in Sturgis, South Dakota (about 20 miles east of Spearfish) kicked off on August 6 with some 700,000 attending. You read that right, nearly ³/₄ of a million people in a town with a population of just under 7,000.
- The Infrastructure Bill can't become law too fast. The Interstates in South Dakota and Iowa are in pretty good shape; the state of disrepair in other states ranges from disappointing to appalling. Decades of neglected maintenance are all too apparent.

The above notwithstanding, the Sioux Falls Corvette Club's Black Hills Corvette Classic is a great event. The 51st edition is scheduled for July 13-16, 2022. If you've never been to the Black Hills, or even if you have, Vicki and I heartily recommend it.





- All show vehicles will be classed as Stock, Modified, or Post 1996 upon arrival by Bull Run Region and decisions are final.
- Stock vehicles, Class A, must reflect equipment available for the year and model vehicle except for minor upgrades and safety modifications.
- Modified vehicles, Class B, must be 25 years old or older based on the vehicle's state registration.
- Post 1996 vehicles, whether stock or modified, are in Class C
- Vehicles may be displayed as the owner wishes within the space allotted and must not interfere with other participants or the flow of traffic. Hoods must be open for best of show judging.
- All vehicles must have a fire extinguisher.
- Vehicles must be driven onto the show field under their own power
- Once parked, vehicles must remain turned off until the meet is over approximately 3:00 pm.
- Vehicles needing to exit earlier must be escorted off the field.
 Contact a Bull Run member to arrange escort.
- Cars with "For Sale" and/or "Raffle" signs must be in the Car Cornal and registered for the show as such.
- Results of the vote tally are final.
- No alcoholic beverages are permitted.
- No food sales unless authorized in advance by Bull Run Region.
- Pre-registration fees are non-refundable except for show cancellation by Bull Run Region.

From I-66 (coming from the west): Trevel I-68 to Est 44 - Route 234 By-Pass (Manassas). Drive about 6 miles and make a left at the light onto Business 234 (Dumfries Rd.) Go another 2.5 miles, take a right at the light onto Prince William Steet, (before milroad underpass) — followings to show an enterpos.

From I-66 (coming from the east): Take I-68 to exit SSA and follow Pits. 25 south, 7.8 miles into Manassas. Turn left onto Grant Ave. (Business 234), go under reliroad overpass and left onto Prince William Street at first light. Follow sign to show car entrance.

From Prince William Parkway (Date City / Woodbridge): At Liberts Avenue light (where Parkway makes left turn) continue straight onto Wellington Rd. Go 1.3 miles to Grant Ave., and turn right. Turn right at second light onto Prince William St.; follow signs to show car entrance.

Trailers: Instructions above are for show cars. Trailered cars should enter into the Osbourn High School parking lot off Main Street, just south of Prince William Street. Show cars can then be driven to the show enterior.
